I had a phone call from someone who said that he was from some outfit called: "Express Couriers" asking if I was going to be home because there was a package for me, and the caller said that the delivery would arrive at my home in roughly an hour.

About an hour later, a delivery man turned up with a beautiful

basket of flowers and wine. I inquired as to who the sender was, the deliveryman's reply was, he was only delivering the gift package, but allegedly a card was being sent separately; (the card has never arrived!). There was also a consignment note with the gift, He then went on to explain that because the gift contained alcohol, there was a $f_{3.50}$ "delivery" charge" as proof that he had actually delivered the package to an adult, and not just left it on the doorstep to just be stolen or taken by anyone. This sounded logical and I offered to pay him cash. He then said that the company required the payment to be by credit or debit card only so that everything is properly accounted for.

My husband, who, by this time, was standing beside me, pulled his wallet out of his pocket with the credit/debit card, and the delivery man asked my husband to swipe the card on the small mobile card machine which had a small screen and keypad where he was also asked to enter the card's PIN and security number. A receipt was printed out and

given to us.

To our horrible surprise, between Thursday and the following Monday, £4,000 had been charged/withdrawn from our credit/debit account at various ATM machines, particularly in the London area! It appeared that somehow the "mobile credit card machine" which the delivery man carried now had all the info necessary to create a "dummy" card with all our card details, after my husband swiped our card and entered the requested PIN and security number.

Upon finding out the illegal transactions on our card, of course, we immediately notified the bank which issued us the card, and our credit/debit account had been closed.

We also went to the Police, where it was confirmed that it is definitely a scam because several households have been similarly hit.

Be wary of accepting any "surprise gift or package", which you neither expected nor personally ordered, especially if it involves any kind of payment as a condition of receiving the gift or package

Minutes of the last Meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on Wednesday 7th November 2012 were taken as read and signed by the Chairman as being a true and accurate record.

Matters Arising

Highways

Cllr Cuthbertson confirmed that Highways have filled some pot holes on Broughton Road, Neil Jefferson (NYCC Highways) confirmed that works in the area were ongoing.

ACTION:

Clerk to send a letter to Richard Flinton, Chief Executive NYCC confirming the contents of the letter received from Ann McKintosh MP and reminding them of the code of practice regarding replying to letters.

Menzies Rent.

Rent has been paid for September and October 2012. Clerk to send reminder for November payment.

Street Lighting Faults.

Column number 16, Middle Street opposite Rose Cottage has now been repaired, this took 13 days to be repaired

Swinton In Bloom.

The last bulbs have now been planted in the play area.

Community Budget Process.

The Amotherby Ward has been allocated \pounds 5,646.00 from the Community Investment Fund (Pot 1).

Swinton have completed the grant application form for **£1,121.44** for the rental of NYCC speed matrix signs for the minimum of 6 weeks per year.

The CIF panel meeting was postponed due to flooding, the date of the resched-

uled meeting is 9th January.

Christmas Lights.

Many thanks to Cllr Cuthbertson who has now erected the Christmas lights on the Reading Room.

Grass Cutting.

Clerk has confirmed that the Parish Council would like Cliffords of Slingsby to carry on cutting the grass in Swinton next year.

Manhole.

Cllr Fenwick updated the Parish Council regarding the manhole outside Farrows. A camera has been put down again and sewage and foul drain has been thoroughly jetted.

Neighbourhood Watch.

Cllr Cuthbertson and Cllr Powell attended the Ryedale Annual General Meeting on 13th November at Pickering Memorial Hall, this was a good meeting with Chief Inspector Kerrin Smith as guest speaker.

Salt Bins.

Gardening Calendar January

January is generally a cold month and often the garden can look a little empty. It's the best time in the gardening year to sit back, take stock and make plans for the forthcoming gardening year.

Take advantage of dry days to do a little essential garden maintenance and clear away any debris in the borders from the previous season.

If you are lucky enough to have a greenhouse there is plenty of sowing you can be doing to get a head start.

Fruit & Vegetables

Prune Apples, Pears, Currants and Gooseberries

Force early rhubarb and chicory

Chit early potatoes

Cover beds with cloches or polythene to warm the soil ready for early sowing

Sow early vegetables under cover: for example, Leek Edison, Onion Unwins Exhibition, Strawberry Temptation, Tomato Moneymaker, Broad Bean Aquadulce Claudi

Jobs around the Garden

Take root cuttings from perennials including oriental poppies, pulsatilla and echinops.

Keep a check on newly planted roses and shrubs

Put out food and water for wild birds

Check newly planted shrubs.

Aeriate lawn taking care not to stand on waterlogged areas.

Keep plants in containers protected from frost and check weekly to see whether they need watering.

Feed established trees in late January
