Swinton Parish Plan Action Items Update

Following the publication of the Swinton Parish Plan in April which has been circulated to every household in the village, as well as to councillors and council officials, the Steering Group met to discuss the next steps.

The Action Plan in the back of the plan has highlighted several areas where it was felt that we needed to begin to try to address some of the issues raised by residents.

With regard to problems with foul and surface drainage at the bottom of West Street, some progress is slowly being made, thanks to pressure from the Parish Council and one or two



individual residents. Meetings and investigations are taking place with the Customer Area Coordinator so hopefully some improvements will be made.

Some vegetation which has been causing problems on footpaths has already been cut back, but more still needs to be done.

We hope to produce a welcome pack for new residents to the village; this will probably not be done until the New Year, but is in the pipeline; any ideas for inclusion in this will be most welcome.

With regard to more community involvement and awareness of what is happening in the village, the regular newsletter has proved very popular and useful, and many thanks must go to Richard Good for the production of this, as well as to the many contributors – please do feel free to use this newsletter as a way to promote an event or drum up some support for organizing an event in the village.

Young people of all ages will soon benefit from improved facilities in the Playground, as well as improvements to the play area at the BSA centre.

One of the things which many residents wanted was more events for all ages – we have already held a Beetle Drive for children, with another one planned for Friday 18 November.

We held a Royal Wedding Family Picnic in April which was very well attended and fun for all the family. We are currently planning the Bonfire & Fireworks Party on 5 November, much the same format as last year.

We will be holding a Village Meeting on October 12th at 7.30 pm in the Reading Rooms. The purpose of this meeting is to encourage more volunteers to join the Events Group and get involved in planning a programme for the coming year, so please do come along and join us.

A local resident had planned a village fete, but unfortunately this did not happen, so the Events Group will begin the planning well in advance for next year, as that was something residents were keen to have.

Many of the other issues concerned traffic, and speeding; these have been taken up with the County Council, but progress here is exceedingly slow.

The group will regularly monitor the Action Plan and inform residents of the situation.

Swinton Through The Census 1871

The 1871 census was taken on the night of 2 April 1871 and gave the total population as 22,723,000.

Details recorded included, Address, Names - the surname and first name, and sometimes the middle name or initial.

Age, Occupation.

Born (county) - name of county given.

Relationship to head of household.

Condition of marriage.

Disability - "blind, deaf-and-dumb, imbecile or lunatic"

There were 93 households recorded in Swinton, 3 less than 1861 and a population of 174 males, 8 fewer than in 1861 and 187 females, 12 less than in 1861.

Unfortunately, only a handful of addresses were noted i.e. Gate House, Swinton Grange, Thricka Castle, All other addresses were noted simply as Swinton.

The first five names listed-Gate House to Swinton
Grange are close to each other in the schedule. Tricka Castle has had its name changed again to Thricka Castle, Which today is known as Trigger Castle, the census enumerator possibly mishearing rather than misspelling the name.

Living in Thricka Castle were Cullon Parkinson and his wife Sara Parkinson, Cullon was possibly a Shepherd, the original Census Document is badly faded so difficult to read.

At Gate house Francis Bointon his wife Jane and their sons Isaac and James and their daughter Hanna were in residence.

In Swinton Grange there was a large household consisting of, William Fewster and his wife Sarah, their sons Thomas and John William, also their daughter Ada. They also had 6 male and 3 female servants.

On the night of the Census

James Rapp and his wife Hanna had two Visitors staying, John Wray and Ann Wray.

The oldest resident was Elizabeth Masterman at 84.

The youngest residents were Eliza Ann Bulmer, Hanna M Nickeson and Annie Harrison all aged 4 months.

There were a number of residents whose place of birth was outside Yorkshire.

Residents having being born in, Burgh Le Marsh and Wrangle, Lincolnshire.

Sutton In Asfield, Nottinghamshire.

East Hendred, Berkshire. Carlton Cropthorne, Worcestershire.

September sees an increase in the amount of chores to do in the garden once again and autumn is not far away.

Now is great time to give your lawn that bit of attention it's needed. Sow a new lawn from seed or make repairs this month.

There are also plenty of jobs to be done in the kitchen garden and crops to be sowed for next years harvest.

Fruit & Vegetables

Sow winter lettuce. Harvest early fruit. Plant overwintering varieties of onion sets.

When your strawberry plants have finished fruiting, cut all the leaves off to the ground. Clear away the leaves and stems and top dress around the plants with Premium Garden Soil.

Take hardwood cuttings of currants and gooseberries. Continue to water vegetable crops and harvest when ready.

Jobs Around the Garden

Autumn is an excellent time to plant containerised trees.
Check on newly planted trees.
Prune out and remove the last of the rose flowers as soon as they have withered.
Plant spring-flowering bulbs such as snowdrops and daffo-

dils.


