In January we had a talk and DVD about Joseph Bazalgette (The Sewer King).

In the mid 19th century London was overwhelmed by the waste products of its ever growing population, raw sewage was everywhere and so was the stench. There were continuous outbreaks of Cholera, in 1853 - 1854 more than 10,000 Londoners were killed by the disease.

It was caused by the sewage contaminating the water system, but this was not recognised as it was thought to be caused by foul air (miasma).

Bazalgette was appointed Chief engineer of London's Metropolitan Board of Works , after many setbacks, his design of an extensive and efficient sewage system was built under London, this had a huge impact on the health of its inhabitants.
