Science, Nature & All Things Technical Group Visit to BBC Studios, The Mailbox, Birmingham. Wednesday 24th May 2017

Twenty members of the Group set off from Stratford railway station by train to visit the BBC Studios at the Mailbox in Birmingham. It was a sunny and warm day and that continued all day. Athena had organised the details of the trip and issued the group railway tickets.

After an uneventful journey we alighted at Moor Street station and walked through the Selfridges shopping centre and then through another shopping centre to New Street railway station. It was a short walk from the station to the Mailbox building. We had plenty of time in hand before the scheduled tour of the studios so we split up into smaller groups for a look

around. After a cup of coffee and a look at the absurdly high prices in some of the stores in the Mailbox building we ventured further in as far as the back of the building, where we found the canal and a host of canal side bistros, cafés, restaurants and pubs. BBC WM radio studios where we saw the three studios that they use with their associated production rooms.

After some explanation about procedures, people and how the programmes are created and produced we moved on to Radio Drama. The most famous drama produced by BBC West Midlands is the Archer series of everyday life in



Ambridge. This series has been running continuously for 67 years; the people in the station are very proud of the programme.

We were able to create our own small piece of drama. A photograph of the drama being created is shown top right.

The next stop was the television studio. This has had a recent makeover and is used for the regional new and also many interviews and other

short programmes about local issues. The local weather is also usually done in the same studio.

The famous red sofa is shown bottom right. A camera with auto-cue is shown centre right. The auto-cue can be either controlled by the presenter using foot pedals (mainly for short pieces) or by a person in the production studio for longer pieces.

The next stop was a production studio for the television programmes.







There are several people in the production studio—producer, director, graphics person, autocue operator, sound recordist.

Finally, it was time to thank our guides and to take our leave. Just time for a group photograph or two.
