China has the longest history of any country in the world, dating from 2,200BC, and Robyn gave us an information sheet on the various dynasties from then to the present time (the course members are up to 500AD!!). We learned about the bronzes dating from 2,000 years, the 6,000 terracotta figures buried

with the Emporer Shi Huangdi in his tomb, the rapid spread of Budhism from India in the first century and the pnilosopher Confucius who lived from 552 to 479BC. Although his "sayings" are often quoted, none of his written texts survive. A fascinating civilisation, well worth studying.

At our meeting on Monday 12th March, Harold Pleasance, who told us recently about his experiences as a Japanese prison-of-war, is going to show us a BBC DVD on what happened after the prisoners were released. It will complete his story. All are welcome – 2pm in the Side Room of the Methodist Hall.
