



Our speaker was Jen Stone, who runs the 'Shakespeare Aloud' group at Shakespeare's Birthplace which performs extracts from Shakespeare's plays and sonnets to visitors. - 15 to 20 times a day to 130 nationalities. On one day there were 3,200 visitors and the group, which normally numbers three, were performing for 8 hours. Jen, who does a lot of work with schools, described how they

entertained a group of French schoolchildren (not very interested in Shakespeare) by getting them to join in a dance. Then there was the Japanese choir, always immaculately dressed, who sang 'Danny Boy' ! Some of the highlights of 2014 were welcoming Michael Hiiggins, the President of the Irish Republic, taking part in a Tudor feast at Mary Arden's House which was cooked by competitors in a Celebrity Master Chef programme for the BBC, and Jen herself acting as godmother at the christening in Holy Trinity Church of the daughter of one of the descendents of Joan Hart, Shakespeare's sister. Inceidentally, there is only one reference in Shakespeare to Christmas, which occurs in the first scene of Hamlet when Marcellus says 'Some say, that ever 'against that season comes wherein our Saviour's birth is celebrated, the bird of dawning singeth all night long ...so allow'd and so gracious in the time'.


WHAT'S ON - MONTHLY MEETINGS AT STRATFORD, SHOTTERY, DENE VALLEY & ALCESTER U3A
