The conductor was Zubin Mehta and pianist Rudolf Buchbinder. It began with the Vienna Fanfare composed by Richard Strauss then the Maskarade Overture to his comic opera composed by Carl Nielson. This was followed by Grieg's only Piano Concerto, played more slowly than some performanc-

es allowing the details to be heard. Then we had Soiree en Vienne composed by Alfred Grunfeld, a paraphrase on Johan Strauss waltz motives. After tea we returned to Scandinavia for Grieg's Peer Gynt Suite No 1, the incidental music for Ibsen's play, Finlandia by Sibelius and the Copenhagen Steam Railway Gallop by Hans Christian Lumbye complete with hoots and whistles. We returned to Vienna for the traditional finale Wiener Blut by Johan Strauss II. It was a light-hearted programme suitable for a summer evening.
