In his well argued introduction to this month's discussion topic "Coalition Government - is it working?", Derek Phillips concluded that in his opinion the answer is an emphatic NO! In recent times there have been only two Coalitions formed in very special circumstances - a hung Parliament in 1929 (lasted only one year) and most notably during the wartime period of

1940/45. As coalition government requires compromises from the parties involved support for various agreed actions is only given grudgingly as it is often in conflict with policies on which their MP's were elected. Also it is unreasonable that a Party with 9% representation in Parliament should have such undue influence on one with 30-35% representation. A classic case of "the tail wagging the dog". Most but not all of the 17 Grumps present expressed similar views and even the dissenters thought the foundations were fairly shaky and acknowledged that serious cracks were now beginning to appear. In a recent survey only 16% of those polled thought the Coalition would last until 2015.
