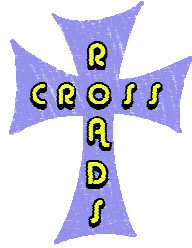

Well, one way to find out more is to come along.

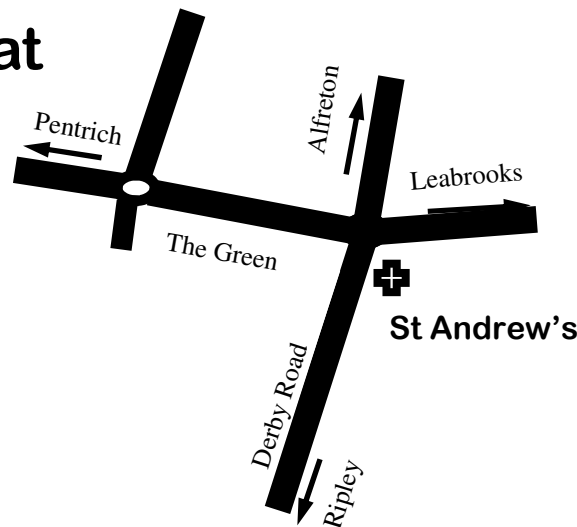

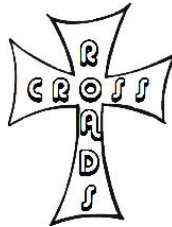
**CrossRoads** is a great way to worship God without worrying about whether you or your children are disturbing someone else.

At **CrossRoads** there is time to make a noise, to listen to stories, to say thank you to God, and to pray in your own way.


At **CrossRoads** You won't need hymn books, you won't need service books, you won't have to know what is the 'right' thing to do.
