When asked if they had learnt things that helped them in school the majority answered with comments such as Jahvarney 'Yes, I never give up' or Shakira 'I still try things if I think I can't do it.'

Ufton Court Adventure Residential Trips

Ufton Court residential trips are open to pupils in Year 3 and above.

Natasha Kirby will be the trip leader supported by staff from our local schools, who will be onsite at all times. All are CRB checked.

The camps are run by the Outdoor Academy. All staff are highly qualified in the Various National Governing Body qualifications, police checked and are First Aid Qualified.
