

Current and Planned Works

<u>Hoardings</u> - The hoardings shall remain throughout the coming month, with adjustments to be made to the Charing Cross Road entrance by Vale Royal House.

Main Works and Q-Parks - UKPN installation is nearing completion. Internal blockwork partition walls to Charing Cross Road and Newport Court are still ongoing, along with the Mezzanine frames through Newport Court and Newport Place. Construction works to the roof feature on the corner unit along Charing Cross Road and Newport Place shall be completed by the end of the month. The Screed to the Service Yard has now been completed and the Veolia area will be handed over by the end of the month.

<u>Community</u> - Collins liaise closely with the local community, CityWest Homes and Vale Royal House and are in continual liaisons with the residents voice committee at VRH, enabling us to work together to complete the remaining project with minimal disruption.
