Everything about crêpes for "La Chandeleur"

Every year, forty days after Christmas, on 2nd February, French people celebrate 'la Chandeleur', the best moment to enjoy and cook these delicious sort of thin pancakes. People usually eat them on Mardi Gras as well even if it's not officially the day of crêpes.

A few historical and religious trivia: originally, 'La Chandeleur' is a religious celebration of Christ's presentation at the Temple, 40 days after his birth on Christmas. 'La Chandeleur', or "Festa candelarum", is, as its Latin name suggests, the day of candles. Traditionally, lots of candles were lighted and brought from the church to home with care, keeping the flame alive. They were then lighted again to keep the evil spirits away. And, most important: as the last celebration of the Christmas cycle, 'La Chandeleur' is the date on which you have to remove the crib. But nowadays, 'La Chandeleur' is mostly a chance to get together with your family and friends, and eat the delicious crêpes!

Les Crêpes

Have you ever wondered why we eat crêpes at la Chandeleur? It turns out that this type of pancake is said to embody the energy of the sun, as well as being a way of exorcising misery and starvation... The first crêpe you make is suppose to presage good harvest. This is why, according to tradition, you have to keep it till next year's Chandeleur in your wardrobe! And if you want to be a perfect 'Chandeleurer', you can even put a Louis d'or (or any old coin) on the crêpe: It will apparently bring you prosperity.

Where to eat "crêpes" around Ashby

If you don't want to spend your time in the kitchen, try one of the local Crêperies: Pear Tree Crêperie at The Heart of the Country Shopping Village in Lichfield, or Yumi Yumi Crepes in Loughborough.

Recipe:

However, you may prefer cooking your own crêpes, which is admittedly quite an exciting activity: avoid your dough going lumpy; slowly blending eggs, plain four, and milk... The secret: add a tad of vanilla, orange essence or beer. Ingredients (Serves 4):

250g (8oz) plain flour Pinch of salt 2 eggs 2 egg yolks

A pint of milk 2 tablespoon of oil or melted butter

Optional:

1/3 pint of ale Juice of one freshly pressed orange

Vanilla 50g sugar

Put the flour and sugar in a bowl. Add the eggs and the yolks. Mix well. Gradually beat in the milk, ale, fresh orange juice and the oil or melted butter. Add the salt and vanilla. Leave for 1 hour, covered with a kitchen towel. Lightly grease a crepe frying pan, and place over medium heat. Cook the first crêpe. Check the mix and add milk to make a thinner batter or add sieved flour if the batter is too liquid. Cook the crêpes one at a time and increase the heat under the frying pan. Turn over the crêpe when light brown on one side.

Tip: nicer to eat warm, you can cook all your crêpes ahead of your meal, and warm them up slightly in the microwave just before eating.

How to fill your crêpes

Crêpes can be filled with sugar, jam, lemon juice and sugar, maple syrup, melted chocolate, ice cream, bananas, cooked apples... Quite simply, sweet or savoury: fill it with whatever takes your fancy! And drink with some dry or sweet cider.
