The following is a letter from Diddier Lamarque to *Courrier du Loiret* on an article in that newspaper detailing local problems not entirely unknown on this side of the Channel:

A *Courrier du Loiret* report on the current situation of trade in Pithiviers: 2 full pages telling us that commerce is in trouble, on the High Street as well as the shopping centre. 2 pages telling us what everyone knows.

As to the conclusion of this impressive investigative work: "no solution other than to press residents to continue to do their shopping in Pithiviers". Instead of saying that "some are looking for answers", why not learn a bit more about these 'some who are looking for answers" and why not invite them to offer solutions? Why didn't the reporter see the town's Mayor, the opposition, our MP, representative of the chamber of trade, Chamber of Commerce, the group of local communities, the traders and the residents to ask them: "What are your solutions"?

When they try to avoid making waves; as seems to be the fashion with the local press, they fail to inform Pithiveriens properly. However, the article by Laurence Dupin seen from one perspective would leave one to think the contrary: 'so does it take a war to get our politicians to react and to try for once listening to each other to get [Pithiviers] France out of this depression in which we are wallowing? You are absolutely right, Laurence Dupin. Once again both we and the press must ask clear questions and demand clear answers.

To all my *Facebook* friends I say: who can give me the name of a person or organization making concrete proposals to get out of this slump while stating these proposals? Just read my various posts to see that there are solutions! And for those who want a summary, here are my proposals:

I ° create a Permanent Council of Commerce composed of all local participants and with a project leader who can go on the ground to meet traders and seek out modern projects.

2 ° Make public the percentage of local purchases by bodies and organizations in Pithiviers and by associations receiving a subsidy from the Town Hall. This in order to encourage them to first think local.

3 ° Support traders who want to sell, a job for the Project Leader of the Council of Commerce, to avoid Pithiviers' future, like now, resting in the hands of the '*right sort*'.

4 ° Give our squares, Martroi and les Halles, their proper roles: meeting places, activities, trading, by installing benches, tables and greenery.

5 ° Give preference to leisure trading in the town centre: bars, theme restaurants, pubs, billiard rooms, with terraces to avoid the drift to Orleans and liven up squares that can be disturbing at night because they are deserted.

6 ° Modernise and harmonise opening hours for municipal facilities but also businesses. In the 21st century and in times of crisis, one should be able to do sports, listen to music, read a magazine, do some shopping... when one isn't working.

7 ° Put back on the agenda local democracy allowing everyone to make proposals and to get a response from elected representatives, something that the internet can easily facilitate. This would also enable Pithiveriens to get to know and understand each other better.

8 ° To allow Pithiveriens easily to find out what there actually is in Pithiviers, to curb the drift towards Orleans or Mammouth (hypermarkets). The Internet deploys the power of a nuclear strike in terms of communication, thanks to Google, Facebook and YouTube. A portal like *pithiviers.info* is an idea.

9 ° Do an education job on the public: buy local - local employment - local services - what's on. But they must be informed 10 ° Enhance our city by means of powerful communication.
