The next morning we rose anticipating a visit to the First World War site, Vimy Ridge with lunch at Albert but it was not to be! Our coach refused to start and after a long and tiring day in this small town we were about to book another night when the 7th cavalry arrived in the form of a Mercedes Benz engineer with a replacement starter motor. The hotel had proved most accommodating with food and drinks but it was

around 5 pm when we left, having missed our visits and we didn't get to Pithiviers until around 9.30 pm. On Friday, we

enjoyed a visit to Chartres' impressive cathedral and the stained-glass



museum. A town tour by Petit Train and excellent lunch rounded off the day before heading back to Pithiviers for the usual warm Civic Reception. Saturday was free with host families and we enjoyed a wide variety of friendly entertainment in the true spirit of



twinning. On Sunday, for those in Pithiviers who wished, the day began with mass in the parish church. At midday we met at the old railway station to take the train to a nearby park, where the twinning picnic was held. Chantal and Joan made their speeches and we presented a framed copy of Magna Carta on its 800th anniversary. There was an excellent picnic buffet before the return and a visit to the railway museum.

On Monday we travelled to the charming



chateau of Vaux-le-Vicomte to see the wonderful buildings, furniture and gardens as well as the carriage museum. There was a delicious lunch in the chateau restaurant. Tuesday and the end of our visit came around all too quickly. In the cold light of dawn we took leave of our generous hosts. The journey back to Calais was largely uneventful and not too slow - until within 5 miles of the port we found ourselves at the centre of a major strike, closing the port and blocking all adjacent ones! In desperation we called our previous week's hotel and - the one bit of



good fortune - they were able to put us all up for the night. The following day, after yet another very early start, we were heading back for Calais, where after a smooth, trouble -free and rapid crossing, we arrived back in Ashby at around midday, after one of the most memorable twinning visits for years!
