The Visit to Pithiviers: 14th - 20th June, 2017

Once again we spent an extra day in France en route to Pithiviers and this



time stayed over night in Reims. On Thursday morning we were free to explore. Most visited the cathedral, famous as the site for the coronation of French kings. Then the choice was an open-top bus tour, museums or just a lazy wander around the historic city and its charming cafes. Mid afternoon we set for Pithiviers to be greeted enthusiastically by our French families.

Friday we were taken to an impressive mushroom farm in the remains of an old limestone quarry by the Loire, where we were able to see the propagation of a



huge number of different varieties and lunch enabled us to taste of some of them before returning to our host families.

Saturday marked the "official" meetings starting with the "Vin d'Honneur" in the morning. Our mayor, Cllr. Jim Hoult and town clerk, Jack Fargher represented the Town Council and gifts were exchanged, as usual. Cllr. Hoult took the opportunity



to announce the inauguration of an annual scheme of awards at schools in both towns for achievements in French or English and the Mayor of Pithiviers made a presentation of an eponymous cake to him.



In the afternoon we went out of town to enjoy the Caribbean-style twinning lunch and, although the extreme hot weather appeared to prevent the planned games taking place afterwards, some members were taken off to visit a local goat farm.

Our Monday visit was not far from Versailles to the theme park "France Miniature". This involved a fascinating



walk effectively around France to see miniature versions of famous or typical buildings from all regions and wellknown cities. Lunch was had on site.



We left Pithiviers on Tuesday morning at the remarkably civilised hour of 7:30 and enjoyed a mercifully uneventful trip home, broken only by a pleasant stop-off for lunch at the Belle Etoile in Arras. scene of last visit's memorable events!

The weather throughout our stay was superb although some might argue a trifle too hot but it was pleasant to bask in the warm sun. As always we were made very welcome and enjoyed both the visits and hospitality offered to us by our good French friends.
