Report from Parish Council Chairman Barry Davolls



Annual Parish Meeting

Lopen is to hold its annual Parish Meeting at 6pm on 14th May, in the schoolroom. This is an informal meeting to provide an opportunity for anyone from the village to come along with their suggestions for the village, or to raise any issue they care to. There is no set agenda and it will be chaired by myself with Carole Mansfield as clerk. Other local parishes use this annual meeting to showcase and celebrate local activities, groups and clubs, as well as inviting speakers from the local authorities and the services. This is something we might aim for in future years, but for this year, we would welcome anyone who wants to contribute to the meeting, in whatever form that may take, as individuals or groups. If you wish to showcase a group or club, please could you let Carole know as soon as you can. In the meantime, we look forward to meeting with you, and hearing your views. The annual Parish Meeting, will be followed by the Annual Parish Council Meeting at 7pm on 14th May.

Lengthsman Funding

Historically, the village Lengthsman was partly funded by the County Council and the District Council with the balance taken from the Lopen precept. Due to cutbacks the future funding of the scheme can no longer be supported in the long term. However, I am pleased to report that a one off transitional payment has been granted by SSDC's Area North Committee, thanks in part to the efforts of our District and County Councillors. This grant will not cover the whole shortfall but it will at least take the pressure off for now.

Core Strategy

South Somerset District Council's Core Strategy (the local development framework) has now received full Council backing. As far as our immediate area is concerned, there are no changes to the increases previously described. The next stage is a further round of public consultation followed by independent plan inspection and public examination. The core strategy has now been re-named as the Local Plan.

Churchyard Grass Cutting

One of the group of volunteers who routinely cut grass in the Churchyard is currently unable to do so. If anyone is willing to take over this important maintenance for the foreseeable future, (I understand this amounts to around an hour each cutting session), please contact me directly.

Bus In Doubt

Having recently reported that the local number 91 bus service had narrowly avoided being cut, I am disappointed to note that, contrary to previous reports, the number 91 service remains in some doubt. At the time of writing, I have been unable to confirm the actual position with any certainty, but I am aware that cutting this service is once again, on the agenda.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH ALERT

This is a general warning message regarding Bogus Callers/Rogue Traders. There has been an increase in some areas of Rogue Traders who call door to door trying to obtain work. This can range from cutting hedges/trees through to replacing roof tiles. Some of these callers are charging exorbitant amounts of money for minor work to be done and can also use 'hard sell' tactics at times. Likewise this time of the year often sees an increase in bogus callers trying to gain access to properties in order to commit crime (such as stealing items). Genuine callers will carry identification and will be happy for it to be checked or for you to arrange a formal appointment for them to attend the property at a later time.


