

REPORT BACK from PARISH CHAIRMAN BARRY DAVOLLS

Budget and Precept 2013-14

On the 21st January, Lopen Parish Council met and agreed the 2013-14 budget and provisionally set the Precept. For the second year running, and to comply with deadlines imposed, the Parish Council has been forced to agree a budget without any certainty regarding the continuation of external grants. In addition to this, there have been significant changes in local taxes to adjust for changes in the way local Council Tax benefits are funded.

Council Tax Benefits Changes

Whilst we were able to agree a budget for next year, we cannot yet be totally clear on the resulting impact to the local taxpayer. An element of the Monitoring Holloway Parish Precept will, in future, meet some of the cost Somerset County Councillor Paul Maxwell of Council Tax benefits (CTB) allowed for Lopen residents and their properties.

The new local CTB scheme is administered and run by South Somerset District Council and, whilst we have been given indicative figures, they have yet to be confirmed. As it stands, without any increase in the budget for next year, there would be an increase of around 1.7% to each property. This increase relates only to the relatively small Precept element and not the whole Council Tax amount.

Unfortunately, it has not been possible to maintain the same budget as last year. This is partly due to uncertainties relating to the external funding of the Lengthsman Scheme, but also recognising that we are likely to face further annual increases in CTB related costs. If as expected, Precept capping is introduced next year, without providing additional reserves to cater for these aspects, we could be left unable to meet potential increased costs in the future and suffer a resulting real terms cut in our Council's budget. On this basis, the budget has been increased from the current £4,882 to £5,220 which represents an increase of 6.9%. Add to this

the yet to be confirmed increase resulting from the CTB costs in relation to the new budget, and the total increase is likely to be around 9.3%.

Whilst the percentage increases are quite high, the actual increase relating to a Band D property Precept element in Lopen will be in the region of £4 per annum.

Internal Auditor

Ian Benfield has kindly offered to take over from Nick George as the Parish Council's internal auditor. Many thanks to Nick for undertaking last year's trouble free audit and, thank you lan for taking on this important role.
