Parish Council Reports Back

Defibrillator *(Barry Davolls writes)*



I am delighted to report that a publicly accessible defibrillator (AED) has now been installed in the porch of All Saints' Church, Church Street, Lopen. If a cardiac arrest is suspected, as with any other medical emergency, always call 999 as a first priority. The AED can be accessed 24/7 simply by opening the door of the wall mounted cabinet located behind the opened porch outer door. Opening the AED cabinet will immediately trigger the alarm system that protects the unit from unwanted attention. **In the case of emergency, any user should ignore the alarm and continue to remove the AED as planned.**

Once turned on, the unit is designed to guide any user - trained or untrained - through all the steps required using diagrammatic and audio prompting messages. (AED-related training sessions are planned to take place in the New Year, the details of which will follow in due course). If the unit is removed, it is vital that the Parish Council is informed as soon as possible following any emergency, not only so we may recover and check the equipment and put it back into use, but also because it may hold important usage data that may be of some assistance to the emergency services.

Our thanks to the partners who helped us to finance and install the AED: the British Heart Foundation, Somerset County Council and Lopen Parochial Church Council, and to Les Farris for coming up with the idea in the first place.

Council Size Consultation *(Barry Davolls writes)*

Following our request to increase the size of Lopen Parish Council from 5 to 7 members, the results of South Somerset District Council's recent local governance review have now been made available. The responses received represent 33% of the local electorate with 57 in favour and 9 opposing the increase. A further consultation is under way (see noticeboard or website) to invite comments on whether or not to accept a majority vote to allow the increase to proceed. This consultation period closes on the 5th December 2014. Our thanks to all those that took the time to respond.

Parish Bulb Planting Scheme

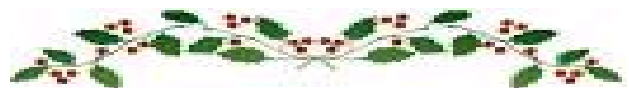
I can now confirm that our free bulbs have been received and have been distributed to those who have offered to help plant around the village. We have noted where the bulbs should not be planted for various reasons. Just as a reminder the bulbs are not Daffodils, but a mix of Grape Hyacinth, Loddon Lily, Snowdrops, Snakes Head Fritillary, English Bluebells and Star of Bethlehem, so should look very pretty come Spring.
