County Cllr Le Hardy reported at the January PC meeting that the Highways Dept. were mightily impressed by the quality and sheer number of responses from such a small village.

LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL

Chairman Nick Jones reports...

Your village needs you more than ever! Once again we have to report the resignation of another Councillor with Teresa Sienkiewicz announcing her resignation just a few days ago. After more than 6 years on the Council, including one as Chair, thanks are due to Teresa for the enormous amount of work she has put in. Her expertise in planning and financial matters will be particularly missed.

As we have yet to have anyone come forward following the previous resignations, we now have three vacancies. This is beginning to become a problem as the council needs a minimum of three councillors present at a meeting in order to legally conduct business and we now have only a very slim margin.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING Saturday 11th March

As I said in December's issue, I am struck by the apparent paradox that although we have high levels of interest in the actions of the council at this time, no one seems to want to get directly involved. I'm also concerned that there also seems a sense that the parish council is remote from the village and it's wishes. With this in mind, and in a departure from what has happened in previous years, we have decided to hold the statutory annual village meeting entirely separately from any Parish Council meeting . This will take place on Saturday 11th March in the Sunday School Room between 2.30 and 4.30 pm. It is an opportunity to come along and talk to the councillors on a completely informal basis. Find out who we are, what we do, tell us what your local concerns are, tell us what you think we should be doing.

In the meantime, if you've lived in the village for a year or more, have a few hours a month to spare and would like to do something for the community, please give some serious thought to joining the Parish Council. An interest in local affairs, desire to help, practical common sense and a sense of humour are the most important qualifications, though a bit of local knowledge is definitely an advantage.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

As many of you will already know, the beginning of December saw the release of the long awaited Small Improvement Scheme consultation document by the County Highways design team. This was extensively discussed at our December meeting , having already been discussed at an emergency meeting of SLOW the day before. I think it is fair to say that it surpassed the fears of even the most pessimistic of us and County Councillor LeHardy was put under considerable pressure to explain the reasoning behind it. In particular, the proposal to increase the speed limit at either end of the village to 40mph, when both the villagers and Parish Council have been consistently asking for a reduction in the speed limit, was very badly received. On a more positive note, nobody, least of all Councillor LeHardy, was left in any doubt that the village residents, SLOW and the Parish Council are completely united in opposition to the scheme as proposed.

Robust responses have been sent by the Parish Council and SLOW. There have also been a large number of excellent individual responses from residents with some very good points raised. Having spoken to the Highways representative I can tell you that they consider the strength and quality of response to be "unprecedented", given the small size of Lopen, and thanked us all for taking the time to give them such carefully considered responses. I'm told they will be making extensive changes to the scheme and it will come back to the Parish Council for consideration and comment when ready.

No timescale has been given so far.

SPEED WATCH

I'm pleased to report that the Speed Watch initiative by SLOW is moving on apace. Eight volunteers have already been trained and the first roadside session took place last Wednesday.
