Parish Chairman Barry Davolls reports back...

Budget 2014-15

We are starting to put together the Parish Council budget for the coming year to assist in setting the Precept accordingly. As ever, there are some unknowns. At the time of writing, the situation regarding any continued Lengthsman funding is unclear as are any possible implications from changes to the local Council Tax Benefit (CTB) scheme. I am aware the costs associated with the Lengthsman duties have increased recently and the early indicators are that the CTB scheme will remain as last year. We are aiming to provisionally agree the budget during our scheduled November meeting which, as last year, will have to be subject to adjustment reflecting the outcome of these two unknowns. If anyone is aware of any potential cost we should be including, or has a suggestion of any new proposal to consider, please make contact with me no later than 11th November.

Unstoppable Expansion?

The effects of the District Council's lack of a five year deliverable housing supply are gathering pace. In the immediate local context, both South Petherton and Martock now have planning permissions in excess of the evidence-based housing need to 2028. This despite the fact the new local plan has yet to be adopted. Even the most hardened planning committee members who in theory take the decisions, and are, in my view, normally over enthusiastic in their 'anything goes' approach to planning, are baulking at the size, style and lack of any supporting infrastructure for many of the applications being approved. At the October Area North meeting, the majority of the members appeared to want to refuse several large (in the local context) housing applications, but were persuaded by SSDC's officers and legal team they actually had no grounds for refusal.

(And the point of electing SSDC councillors to represent local views is? Ed.)

Yet More Development at South Petherton?

I understand that there are more developers with imminent and even bigger housing applications planned for South Petherton before the door of opportunity closes and that these follow the current trend of green field first expansion.

Eggwood Hill

A draft 999 year lease has been received from the County Council and the three parishes of Lopen, Merriott and Hinton St George are in the process of instructing solicitors to act on their behalf. At this stage at least, we cannot foresee any significant difficulties with the lease and it is hoped the matter will be concluded during early 2014 subject to the Parish Councils agreeing final details.

Defibrillator

Following the most welcome receipt of a grant from Somerset County Council toward the cost of providing a village based defibrillator, a top-up grant application was submitted to the British Heart Foundation on the 3rd of October, the outcome of which should be known around Christmas time. Assuming we are successful in securing the additional funds required, we would hope to have a unit available during the first quarter of 2014.

Speed Indicator Device (SID)

I have now received the figures for the September and October Lopen SID installations, which do not report anything particularly unusual. I have also reviewed as much historical data as I have available to spot any trends. Basically, since 2010, not much has changed. **Around 85% of all movements through the village are at a speed of around 39mph and in terms of numbers, these have been fairly constant at around 2600 movements per day (1300 in each direction).**

Mrs LILY MORGAN

Mrs Morgan, mother of Cynthia Dadzitis and Barry and Clive Morgan, died on October 15th.

A villager remembers....

"Lopen has never been the same since Lily Morgan retired some years ago after running the village shop and post office in School Lane for many years with her family providing support when it was needed.

To give just a couple of examples of the service Lily provided:

If she came across a special offer at her wholesaler she would buy it knowing that someone would appreciate it. A power failure and Mrs Morgan would be open early for candles. The shop would open at 6am, so early workmen could call to collect lunches and lorry drivers would often park at the bottom of School Lane to call in for a ham roll - with three slices of ham something of a loss leader but the profit was in the extras they bought.

Mrs Morgan loved her fellow humans and they loved her. She will not be forgotten."

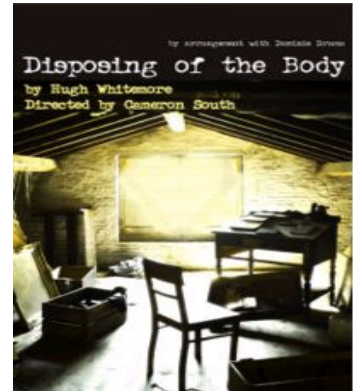
