Farewell to Carole

Carole Mansfield, our Parish Council Clerk who took over from Enid King last October, is to leave us at the end of September. Carole has been a real asset to the Parish Council over the last year and we will surely miss her. I feel sure everyone who knows Carole would join me in wishing her all the best for the future. **Kim McDonald** has been appointed to take over from Carole from the 1st October this year.

Eggwood Hill

Recent developments suggest that the unauthorised occupants at Eggwood Hill will be vacating the site in the near future. This will allow the site to be secured and the long awaited transfer of ownership to the three parishes of Lopen, Merriot and Hinton St. George to take place. Once this has happened, the three parishes will have an opportunity to enhance this area to provide a welcome and useful amenity for local residents. I suspect a call for volunteers will be made not only to carry out much of the initial work required but also to assist with the inevitable ongoing future maintenance. I have no doubt that Lopen residents will, as usual, willingly commit to this wonderful opportunity.

Speed Indicator Device (SID)

The speed indicator device was installed on Holloway in Lopen during August and the figures recorded indicate that those driving within the 30 mph limit remains stubbornly low. 81% of all movements recorded were in excess of the speed limit with 12% at 40mph and above. The total number of vehicle movements (assuming equal flows in both directions) is in the region of 2500 per day.

Ragwort - Pretty but Poisonous



You may have seen reports in the local news that outbreaks of the poisonous weed Ragwort is, despite being controlled by the Weeds Act, on the increase throughout the country. Lopen, thanks to the ongoing efforts of the many responsible local land owners, has been relatively clear of this weed until now. Even before Ragwort made the news headlines, Lopen (and other local parishes) were receiving reports that significant outbreaks were taking hold in local areas without any obvious attempts being made to control its spread. Ragwort can be a killer. It is common knowledge that horses are particularly susceptible to the effects of Ragwort but it should be noted that almost all grazing animals can be damaged by repeated ingestion. If you have Ragwort on your land which is in the vicinity (up to 100mtrs) of any grazing animals or land used for feed/forage, please take action to safely remove it. (*Defra guidelines available on the Village website/Parish Council page.*)

Minor Planning Applications

The number of planning applications received for the Lopen area over the last year has been exceptionally high. As a result, and given the absence of any other method of handling these applications, Lopen Parish Council has held a number of extraordinary meetings to meet the deadlines imposed by the Planning Authority for comments. As many of the applications made were for minor works only and, in virtually all cases, there were no concerns raised, at its last meeting Lopen Parish Council adopted a Scheme of Delegation to facilitate the response to some future applications without the need to hold a public meeting. *The details of this scheme are posted under the Parish Council section on the village website and the scheme is effective immediately.*

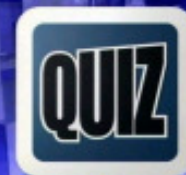

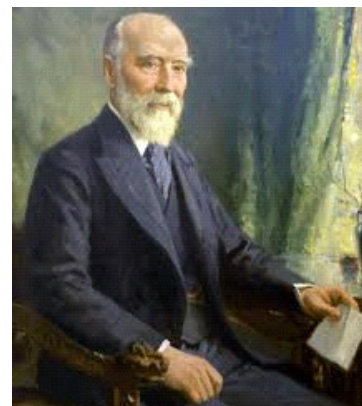
