Parish Council Reports Back

Precept 2015/16

During our December meeting a budget was agreed for 2015/16 but the exact cost to the local taxpayer could not be confirmed as figures beyond our control (the tax base and Council Tax Reduction Scheme Grant) had not been published. We had hoped that the figures would remain as for last year, and so would result in an increase of 1.99%.

Since then, the outstanding information has been received and, disappointingly, the grant has been reduced and the tax base varied. With these changes applied, the same budget now shows a 3.59% increase resulting in an uplift in the precept charge of £1.66 per band D property per year, which was formally accepted during our recent January meeting.

South Petherton Local Plan

During Lopen PC's meeting on the 26th January, members of the recently formed South Petherton Local Plan Committee gave a short briefing on their plans going forward. Graham Gatehouse (Parish Council member) and Paull Robathan (Committee Chair) attended our meeting. Paull explained the trigger for this process was concern within the South Petherton community over the scale of development being thrust upon them and their wish to gain some control to limit the numbers and to establish the community's view on what is acceptable/preferred development.

The first stage would be to update the existing village plan which will deal with very broad issues (including aspects not related to planning) and he hoped this would be completed over the next 6 months. After this, if it was considered there was merit in proceeding to adopt a much more formal plan (more legally binding) in the form of a Neighbourhood Plan, this would follow on, and an application has

already been submitted to South Somerset District Council to approve and establish a Neighbourhood Plan area. In this case covering the entire administrative area of South Petherton PC. Over the coming weeks their intentions will be advertised followed by extensive community engagement and consultation including our PC where/if appropriate.

Eggwood Hill Site

Our attempts to acquire the lease for the Eggwood Hill site together with Hinton St. George and Merriott PCs continues. All three Councils have now agreed the draft lease subject to conditions (chiefly an indemnity from any unforeseen site pollution aspects and improvements to the condition/security of boundary fences). Somerset County Council have yet to respond to these conditions and the matter can not yet be concluded.

Election on 7th May

With the Local (and National) elections being held in May, the current Lopen PC team have only a few months left to serve and now is the time to encourage new potential members to put themselves forward for election. We have yet to receive confirmation that our request to increase the Council size from 5 to 7 members has been approved, but we should know the outcome of this soon.

I personally hope we have sufficient candidates coming forward (more than the Council size) to trigger an election within Lopen (we have budgeted for it). It is much healthier all-round if the local population choose their Council members rather than, as it was with the current administration, simply made up of those who applied. If anyone is considering standing and wants to find out more about the role and what it entails, I will gladly make myself available to do this.

It was decided by a unanimous vote at the Extraordinary General Meeting of January 20th that activities of the Lopen History Group should be suspended for the time being.

(The Group, founded some twenty years ago, will remain in suspension whilst two of its members work on turning the large amount of the documentation of Lopen's past into digital form.)

This regrettable turn of events is simply because the committee has retired after several years in office and, despite appeals in Lopen Eye and elsewhere, no one has come forward to manage the affairs of the Group. The History Group has a good number of members who have attended regularly the monthly talks and its finances are in a healthy condition. An alternative motion to disband the Group completely was rejected without opposition.

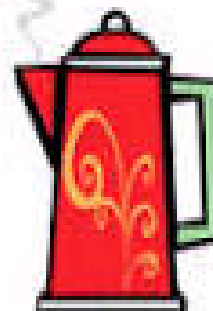
