At the October Parish Council meeting it was reported that, after having some technical difficulties with the batteries for the Speed Indicator Device (SID), the manufacturers would be contacted about the life of the charge in the batteries. The SID has now been put back into service. As a result of discussions it was decided to change over the battery on a weekly basis, before the battery actually 'goes flat', to ensure the SID keeps working. This duty has very kindly been undertaken by members of Safer Lopen Now (SLOW). We hope the battery issue has now been resolved however, if anyone notices the SID not working, it would be very helpful to advise a member of either the Parish Council or SLOW, so that the matter may be investigated. Thank you!

#### VILLAGE SUPPER PARTY






We had a full house for the village supper and I believe everyone enjoyed it. I was able to send off
