This year is an election year for the Parish Council, so anyone interested in standing should please contact Lisa, the Parish Council Clerk, for the relevant paperwork. We are at present down by two councillors so please give it some serious thought and maybe put something into your community?

Following our latest meeting on Monday 21st January 2019, I am able to tell you that we are well on our way to resolving the teething troubles with our Speed Indicator Device (SID). After some very exhausting conversations with the supplier's Technical Section between Nick and Simon, it has now been possible to limit the display of excessive speeds to 40 mph but to still record the actual speeds. Hopefully this will deter those drivers intent on seeing how fast a speed they can register on the SID. Also, we are now able to download data in a more usable format which is easier to interpret. We will keep you posted on our progress.

At our previous meeting it was decided that we would purchase some bags of rock salt for spreading on the pavements (only in icy conditions). The bags are now here and are being distributed around the village. So far – and thanks to the kindness of the householders – they are available at Ballarat House (Frog Street), Shore's Farm (Main Street), 'Oswalds' (Church Street) and Cobwebs (Church Street).

#### RAINFALL UPDATE

Jeremy Rook has kindly supplied the following data: after a wet November and December, 2018 ended up as an average rainfall year. We had a dry, warm summer but we also had a very wet March, so the damp end and beginning of the year gave us an average year for rainfall. I believe our local reservoir at Sutton Bingham is full now.

The 6 month period 1st May to 31st October was the 5th driest 6 month period in my 30 years of recording. To date in January we have had only 25mm - about 30% of the Long Term Average for Lopen for January. January in 1997 and in 2000 were drier than that but 1997 ended up average and 2000 wetter than average which goes to show that prediction is difficult from one month's figures.

Having been in use for about 4 months now we have progressed through the usual start up issues of Personnel, Equipment and Operators to where we believe a routine has been established that will give us accurate and regular data from now on.

Better analysis will also be possible as we move on but just give a flavour of the last recorded session over the first 2 weeks of 2019. Roger Gurner - Co-Chair SLoW
