LOPEN PLANT FAIR EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS!

A brilliant result was achieved again on Saturday May 6th by all involved in the running of the annual Plant Fair. Thanks to the tremendous support by those in the village, and beyond, a total of £1,280.92 was raised from the plants, teas and raffle; up over 25% from last year. This is quite an



achievement for a small village like ours. So, a very big thank you to the team and to all those who supported the event. As always, all profits from this event go towards the upkeep of the our church and Sunday School Room.

CAR CRASH AT LOPEN HEAD

On Tuesday May 2nd, at about 8.00am, two vehicles were involved in an accident at the Lopenhead roundabout, opposite the Lopen Raj restaurant.

A Vauxhall Astra had damage to the front end, whilst a Land Rover Discovery was on it's roof. An ambulance was called and attended to two people who sustained minor injuries. Somerset Highways cleared oil & other fluids and debris from the collision. The scene was cleared by 11am and traffic was flowing freely again.



We have now carried out 23 sessions within the 30mph zone. Of the 5,400 vehicles observed to date 257 have been reported, and of those, 105 (or almost 41%) have been travelling at 40 MPH or faster, including one at 62mph!

Reports back from CSW Central Records are now beginning to include our own reports, and the most recent indicate that two of those observed in Lopen during March have now been interviewed by police for having been reported more than three times across

the area.

We have had two new helpers trained this month, but more are always welcome. Anyone interested should contact either Ben Goldsmith (249 231) or Roger Gurner (249 253) for further details.

ANNUAL MEETING & NEW COUNCILLOR

The recent annual meeting saw Nick Jones returned to the Chairmanship with Stephen Crane remaining as Vice Chairman.



We were also fortunate enough to be able to co-opt Valerie Canton as a new councillor. A village resident for 17 years, with previous experience of committees and event organisation, we believe she is a valuable addition and warmly welcome her to the Council.

NEW COUNCILLORS

As well as the co-option of a new councillor we have also had one further firm expression of interest, which will hopefully result in another co-option at the next meeting. This would bring us to 6 councillors, which is a very much better position. This would leave one further vacancy, so there is still the opportunity to join if you wish.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

There have been no further developments on this to report in spite of some prompting. It is likely that the recent change of County Councillor has caused a pause. However, we were assured at our previous meeting that a change of Councillor would not stop the project and new Councillor Adam Dance is determined that it will continue, so we expect to have news soon.

SPEED WATCH

Following up on the matter of the speeding school buses, we have now received responses from two of the three bus companies we wrote to and continue to chase the third. We also have had a reply from Somerset County Council who tell us that they have also written to the companies concerned. It will be interesting to see whether all this has any effect on their behaviour on the roads!

FOOTPATHS

Sunday 21st of May saw the first footpath clearance event with 12 volunteers working to clear some of the

more overgrown footpaths around the village. There was also a children's treasure hunt and organisers Ed & Jo Moore provided a very fine barbecue afterwards with very locally grown pork and sausages. It was a useful and very pleasant afternoon, which we hope to repeat a little later in the year to tackle any further growth.

Staying with footpaths, the SCC footpaths team deserve an honourable mention. This year, as well as providing steps and guard rails on the footpath that climbs the bank out of Holloway, they have also recently



provided a smart new wooden bridge over Lopen Brook near Manor Farm where the old concrete one was falling into the stream. The new wooden bridge was provided within two weeks of

being reported via their website, which is an impressive performance I think and proves that the system works.

The Police Rural Crime team are busy again. Last summer saw a spike in livestock theft and the team are working hard to prevent this happening again this year. Keep your eyes and ears open. If you see livestock being moved and you think

it is a strange time of day or night, please call us. Legitimate farmers do not mind being stopped by us and this may prevent or detect crime.

Now that we are entering the summer/holiday season, it is especially important not to become complacent about security. It is the period in which the opportunist criminals take advantage and:

- Enter open front or rear doors whilst residents are in the garden.
- Enter doors or windows that have been left open or insecure at night whilst residents are asleep.
- Reach through insecure windows to steal property.

When you go on holiday:

- Take steps to make your house look occupied.
- Ask a trusted neighbour to open and close your curtains for you.
- Put a timer on some of your lights – do not leave a landing light on.
- Cancel your milk and paper deliveries.
- Ask a neighbour or friend to park their vehicle on your drive.
- Cut your lawns and hedges and make sure the hedge to the front of your property is cut to below three feet to aid surveillance.
- Do not advertise that you are going away on social media.

NO CHURCHWARDEN FOR LOPEN

We were very pleased to have such a good attendance at our 2nd Vestry meeting on 9th May. However, we were unable to appoint a Churchwarden. This does leave us without an important leader and representative for the church and village community. However, it does not mean that Lopen church is at risk of closure.

At the meeting we successfully shared out some of the many tasks which come under a Churchwarden's responsibilities. We are very grateful to those of you who have stepped up to take on new roles. This is encouraging for all of us who care about Lopen church and its place in our community. A list of these tasks and roles will be in church shortly, and there is room for more volunteers!

It is not a perfect solution. There is no longer a key person (or persons) for the Rectors, fellow Churchwardens, Archdeacon and Bishops to confide in and liaise with. Bob and Julia will do their best to ensure that Lopen is as well represented as possible on all occasions, but we very much hope that we can appoint new Churchwardens in 2018.

NATURE NOTES

Observations around the village this month:

From Steve Chapman in Frog Street - the swallows have returned! This morning we witnessed swallows flying in and out of our open barn at Ballarat; this will be the third year they have nested here. Previously jackdaws nested in the crevices under the roof but when the roof was renovated, the jackdaws were thwarted and the swallows took up residence. It is a wonderful sight seeing them flying over the fields feeding and then swooping over the garden wall into the barn - they usually stay until September.

Rare Goldcrests have also been spotted in the garden.

house martins back with nests under the eaves at both back and front of the house. These migrants are now increasingly scarce, I regret to say, and I think we are now the only house in Lopen to host them.

From Les Morton in Church Street - we have seen three Roe deer in the field (looks like a juvenile male with two females), along with a fox and various rabbits.

The woodpeckers are around along with Goldfinches, Greenfinches, Bullfinches and a lone Yellowhammer.

FIBRE BROADBAND

Yes! The fibre is available in Lopen, and quite a few residents have already connected and are enjoying great speeds. Depending on the service that has been upgraded to, average fibre speeds seem to be around the 35-40mbs whilst a couple of residents have opted for the faster service and are getting about 75mbs!

A strange anomaly of the installation of the new fibre service is that some houses in Frog Street are also enjoying faster standard broadband speeds - an increase from around 2-3mbs to about 10-12mbs.
