The PCC felt that it would be helpful to give you all an update on the improvements to the school room. Last year the unstable chimney and fireplace were removed and the roof void thatched over. In March,


taking advantage of the additional space, the kitchen work space was extended and the floor will be professionally sanded and sealed in June. This has been funded by a lottery grant, a generous personal donation and the Waitrose Green Token Scheme, all at zero cost to All Saints Church.

The PCC is keen to make further improvements to the school room and its facilities to benefit the community. As a result it has initiated the setting up of a small group of PCC and non PCC residents to investigate and recommend improvements in the facilities to the PCC.

At its first meeting in February the focus was on health and safety items and in April longer term items such as lighting, greener heating, wi-fi and audio-visual aids. The objective will be to formulate a costed plan of improvements for the room to recommend to the PCC.

COUNCILLORS WANTED

With just four of a possible seven positions occupied, the Council currently has three vacancies and needs your help. If you are interested in village matters, have a little time spare and count common sense, patience and a sense of humour among your virtues, why not consider becoming a councillor? ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

As you will know, this is election year for South Somerset District and Parish Councils. There are seven vacancies for Lopen Parish Council however, as only four people came forward prior to the cut off date to stand, all four candidates will be elected unopposed thus negating the need for a full election.

Therefore, at the Annual Parish Council Meeting on 13 May 2019, the existing Parish Council will stand down and the new candidates will take their place. Obviously, it is not ideal to have a reduced number of Councillors, so we are actively seeking people to fill the vacant positions and would encourage interested parties to come forward. Please contact the Parish Clerk who will be happy to give you any information you need or answer your questions. The statutory Annual Village Meeting will also take place on 13 May starting at 7pm. This is an informal meeting giving villagers the opportunity to raise any matters of concern to them about the village. The Parish Council Meeting will then follow at 7:30pm, though villagers are welcome to stay as observers to the Council meeting.

FROGMARY GREEN FARM

The LPC discussed a planning application from Sustainable Energy Generation Ltd, to increase the amount of Feedstock imports and digestate exports to and from their Frogmary Green Farm biogas plant. The application requests a variation of the conditions to the original permission to increase the imports from just under 20,000 tons

per annum to just under 70,000 tons per annum with exports of digestate to increase from 0 to nearly 60,000 tons per annum! LPC has sent a letter of objection to The Planning Officer, on the grounds that increased traffic movement - from the applicant's own figures - equates to an additional 8,500 heavy vehicle movements per year, bringing the total to over 10,000, with harvest-time peaks of 170 vehicles per day. Based on a 10 hour day, that is something in the region of one vehicle movement every 3.5 minutes on harvest days. This was considered excessive given the width and condition of the service road from Lopen Head and the surrounding road network. There is also concern that the existing plan is not actually able to process that much feedstock making further applications to expand it likely if this permission were to be granted.

BURIAL SERVICE - LOPEN CHURCH, SATURDAY 4TH MAY AT 12 MIDDAY.

Elizabeth Harrington Lynch would welcome anyone from Lopen to come to a short service and burial of her late husband's ashes. William Mansfield Ford Lynch, was the maternal grandson of Rosina Goodland, whose father was the last family owner of Court Farm in Lopen. Rosina emigrated to the USA with her husband, William Ford, of Hook Manor, Tisbury, in about 1900, shortly after they were married at Court Farm (see picture below). One of his maternal great aunts was Violett Layzell, whose mother was Eva Goodland and Rosina's sister. (She lived at Hinton Cottage by the Mill in Lopen and was the Nursing Tutor in Yeovil Hospital). William was an extraordinary man - he was a diplomat specialising in China/Asia and the Middle East. He served in senior positions in the White House under four US Presidents.
