FOOTPATHS

Steve Chapman has reported that the event held on October 13th. was attended by 55 people and raised over £700 for Benefice of Merriott, Hinton St George, Lopen and Dinington.

ROAD CLOSURES



Gigaclear will be continuing their broadband cabling in the area in November.

Of particular interest to Lopen are:

Kitchens Lane, Lopen - from the junction with Fosse Way to the junction with Water Lane, a distance of 585 metres. The proposed date of the closure is **2nd November 2018 for 10 days.**

Water Lane, Lopen - from the junction with Water Street for its full extent, a distance of 36 metres. The proposed date of the closure is **12th November 2018 for 5 days.**

PRECAUTIONARY ROAD GRITTING TO BE CANCELLED IN LOPEN

SCC are reducing the number of roads that will receive precautionary gritting, and included in that list is Watergore Road and the road through Lopen & Merriot. This could prove interesting with the amount of HGV traffic and the fact that it's a steep hill in the shade with a double bend, and also the camber of the road at the Lopen Head roundabout. Roads removed from the precautionary network will continue to be treated as part of the secondary network in the event of prolonged periods of ice and snow. SPEED INDICATION DEVICE (SID)

Stephen Crane (Chairperson Lopen Parish Council) and Roger Gurner (Co-Chair SLoW) with the new SID that has been installed after the generous donations of the people in Lopen.

Of the 22,292 vehicles recorded over that period only 8,638 were travelling at 30mph or less meaning that around 60% of all traffic through Lopen during those 21 days was exceeding the official speed limit. Of the remainder, 11,355 were shown at between 30 and 40mph with almost 2,297 recorded at between 40 and 70mph. The most terrifying statistic, however, must be that 2 vehicles were travelling at more than 80mph through the centre of the village - one of them between 3pm and 7pm. All this data will be passed to the police Speed Enforcement Unit to enable clearer targeting of their presence in the village.

It is worth noting that during the 6 days of this session that the SID was used with the display turned off those exceeding the speed limit rose by almost 6%. Evidence, if needed, that its visible presence contributes a positive effect.



RAINFALL UPDATE

Jeremy Rook has kindly supplied the following data :- Another month on the dry side - I recorded 52mm in September which is 80 % of the Long Term Average. Over half of that fell on one day - Saturday the 22nd. In the 5 months May to September we have had only 60% of the LTA for that period, and of course many days of high temperatures. Looking back through my records (from Haselbury Plucknett) I can only see the 5 months April to August 1995 as being drier. On a rolling 12 month basis we have had 87% of the LTA - saved by the very wet March.
