As we get closer to the fair, donations of plants would also be most welcome, so please remember us when you are in the garden or greenhouse!

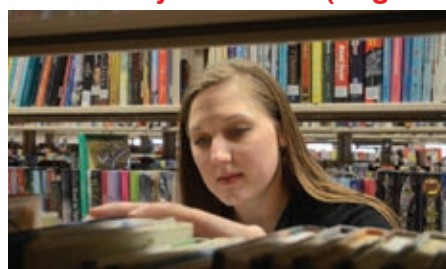

OUR LOCAL LIBRARY UNDER THREAT

To ensure communities have sufficient time to explore these options the consultation period has been extended for a further 7 weeks, ending Wednesday 13th June (originally 22nd April).

Service. Our local library at South Petherton is earmarked for closure. In summary, under the proposals, 15 of Somerset's 34 libraries would be seeking community involvement to remain open."

LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL NEW COUNCILLORS

Jed Burrows has recently resigned due to ongoing work commitments. We thank him for his work whilst on the council and wish him well. This means the Council now has **two vacant positions**. SUPERFAST BROADBAND

This will be covered in more detail elsewhere in this issue however, to summarise, we are aware that the new cabinet (17) has not meant that everyone in the village can get a superfast connection. This is partly due to the historical split between two service cabinets, which unfortunately remains. It is also due to incomplete work and very poor records keeping by BT OpenReach. If you are having trouble getting upgraded, please get in touch with Roger Gurner who is working very hard to get a complete picture of the situation and to get as many households connected as possible.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

Somerset County Council recently announced their intention to resurrect their previously free SID service as a pay-to-play service. To equal the rather infrequent service (8 weeks total roadside time) we have been receiving for the last few years would cost £400 p.a. under this proposed scheme. They would be re-using the elderly units in service since 2009 and concerns have been raised about their reliability.

The parish council has therefore decided to continue exploring the possibility of owning and operating our own unit. While this will cost more overall, it would allow much more roadside time and actually cost less per day in operation. At the time of writing, we have no partner council in prospect, though there are still some options to be explored. This potentially means having to fund it completely ourselves which, while a bit of a challenge, is not unrealistic with a bit of additional fundraising. We'll be talking about this at the annual parish meeting in May and would like to hear your thoughts on the subject.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The statutory annual village meeting will be held entirely separately from any Parish Council meeting, as it was last year. The intention is to have a PC presence at the plant fair on Saturday 12th May, followed by a short meeting in the evening. We are

investigating the possibility of getting local food suppliers to come along to the evening session to provide some "bait"!

It is an opportunity to come along and talk to the councillors on an informal basis. Find out who we are, what we do, tell us what your local concerns are, tell us what you think we should be doing. This year, more than ever, we'd really like to see you as we are going to be updating the parish plan and need your input. We would also like to get your views on the purchase of a speed indicating device and ideas about how to help with its funding.

LIBRARY CONSULTATION

Following on from my remarks last month, due to strong public response, the libraries consultation has been extended until June 13th. The questionnaire has also been altered to allow more area-specific responses. It is stated that previous responses remain valid, but you can also have another go if you wish, and South Petherton library in particular needs all the help it can get! SPRING CHILDREN'S WORKSHOP

This was held on Saturday 10th March and was well attended by children and parents. Gifts for Mothering Sunday were made with the ultimate being non-fattening cupcakes! There were also delicate jewel covered breakfast eggs, egg cups and trees for the new orchard in Lopen. These were produced and taken home following a very happy workshop. However only a few decorated biscuits survived until leaving time! There will be variations on these ideas to be made during Children's Workshops later in the year.



SUPER FAST BROADBAND IN LOPEN

In early 2016 Lopen was advised that SFB would not be available in the foreseeable future, since it hadn't been included by CDS (Connecting Devon and Somerset) in the current proposal. Further, it was unlikely to be part of the target of up to 95% coverage of rural areas funded by government and EU. Despite this, in December 2016, underground cable ducts and a concrete base were constructed in Holloway and in mid January 2017 a cabinet was installed to the base. Two weeks later cabling was connected from South Petherton exchange to the new cabinet 17 to upgrade it to SFB status and integrate it with the existing local copper cable distribution network. Some residents were soon experiencing much improved broadband speeds, but more were experiencing real difficulties attempting to update because the cabling had not been extended to cabinet 11 at Frog Street. Worse, the new connections were incorrectly recorded in OpenReach's database leading to much confusion.

OpenReach engineers attempting a new connection discovered these inaccuracies and made manual corrections causing even more confusion where customers previous connected to cabinet 17 were moved to cabinet 11 denying any upgrade. Not continuing SFB cabling to cabinet 11 has excluded about 40% village and all of the Mill Lane estate. Further complicated by awarding Phase Two to GigaClear, OpenReach did not tender, who will offer SFB to the premises - involving considerable disturbance and expense due to roadworks and higher connection costs for a service which may not be available before the end of 2019. Attempts to resolve the situation over the past 12 months finally resulted in

Matt Barlow - Stakeholder Engagement Officer for CDS agreeing to address the PC meeting on 22nd March. What emerged was a total rejection of any attempt to oblige OpenReach to enable cabinet 11. Instead we must accept GigaClear.

Surely, the only sensible solution, in terms of both time and cost is to oblige OpenReach to enable cabinet 11 and for CDS to fund this without delay. Meantime, Matt Barrow is to provide me with an accurate list of properties able to access SFB and with this I intend to approach more senior personnel within CDS and Government to attempt to achieve such a decision. 3 year old - 80cm whips - field grown

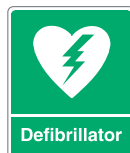
