# SOMERSET OPEN STUDIOS 2018

Somerset Open Studios 2018 will run from 15-30th September and draws Art Weeks back to its roots, focusing on artists in their working environment. Featuring over 300 artists in 192 venues, visitors will be able to see how artists make their work; their process, practice and inspiration. There will be two locations in Lopen - Pauline Rook will be mostly showing new photographs using a rather different photographic technique - Infra red - with some dramatic photographs taken in Kenya alongside her more usual Somerset based rural photography. She is joined this year by Jo Mills with her Somerset baskets, Peter Thomas with his lovely wood turning and James Crowden with his books. Everyone is welcome to come to the opening night on Friday 14th September 5pm-8pm at the Old Cider Shed behind Lopen Farmhouse, Church Street.

Inspired by her charming natural garden at **Manglehouse, Denman Cottage Church Street**, Angela Naunton Davies explores a close relationship between plants, ink, paper and press, producing individual monoprints of exquisite detail and form. She will be joined by Marcus Jubb who designs unique solar powered garden chandeliers to enhance outside spaces and gardens scattering light and rainbows; handcrafted with recycled materials. And Heidi Warr who designs and creates hand-built and hand-thrown earthenware vessels, intricately decorated using traditional techniques. Her collectable artworks are bold statement pieces merging the traditional with the contemporary.

# LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL

The highlight of the meeting is that the Parish Council took the decision to purchase a Speed Indication Device (SID) for the village to use. I am pleased to say that the SLOW Campaign managed to convert all of the pledges into funds, which have been paid into the Parish Council bank account. This has enabled the Parish Council to place the order and we hope the SID will be with us soon - hopefully by the end of September! The second matter that stands out from the last meeting was the interim report given by Simon Frackiewicz on the results of the Village Survey. Although it was only a preliminary report it was most interesting and I for one certainly look forward to the final results; it will go a long way to informing the Parish Council of the views of Lopen residents and helping us to make future decisions. Further to the Nippybus ceasing trading in November 2017 Transport Somerset are now in a position to provide a timetabled bus service in the Ilminster area, including Lopen, using their in-house fleet Slinky bus. Operating from Martock the bus will provide a Demand Responsive Service in the same

area as the previous Nippybus Demand Responsive service. Unfortunately they have no records of the registered users of the previous Nippybus service so would appreciate it if residents could register to use the service once again by calling **01935 411572/477399**. Initially the service will operate on a first come first served basis, but as passenger numbers grow they



may want to target the service in certain areas on certain days of the week as they do with other Slinky bus services in the County. This will ensure that all residents in the area have access to the service. The Slinky service will commence on Monday 3 September 2018. The service will operate on Monday

to Fridays between the hours of 0900 and 1700 and, after registering to use the service, bookings can be made by contacting SSVCA at least 24 hours in advance on 0844 800 9646 Monday to Friday between 0900 and 1700.

English National Concessionary Bus Passes will be accepted for travel on this service at all times.

#### ROAD CLOSURES



Gigaclear will be continuing their broadband cabling in the area from September 10th. Of particular interest to Lopen are:

Water Street and Frog Street, Lopen - from the junction with Holloway Road to the junction with Water Lane, a distance of 217 metres. The proposed start date is 15th September 2018 for 5 days.

Church Street and Rydon Lane, Lopen - from the junction with Holloway Road to 130 metres east of the property Hazelwood House, a distance of 480 metres. The proposed start date is 26th October 2018 for 7 days. Access to properties will be maintained.

School Lane, Lopen - from the junction with Holloway Road to outside of the Old School House, a distance of 80 metres. The proposed start date is 28th October 2018 for 5 days. Access to properties will be maintained.

Full information will be posted on the village notice board.

#### RAINFALL UPDATE

Jeremy Rook has kindly supplied the following data -18 mm of rain was recorded in June - almost all was a thundery shower on the 1st of the month. This is the driest June since 2000, when we had 13 mm which was followed by a wet July. July was another dry month with a total of 19mm of rain, however it was not as dry as July 2016 when we had only 3mm in the month. The two months combined was only 37 mm which together with the long heatwave caused the only too visible drought.

As a matter of interest on a rolling 12 month basis we are almost spot on the Long Term Average of 790 mm, due to the very wet March we had this year. The wet March is why the reservoirs have held up during the drought.

Looking back to see if there were any drier periods of 2 consecutive months, August & September 2003 - 29 mm in total and May & June 1989 - 30 mm. "I didn't record the rainfall in 1976 though!"
