## REPORT BACK from PARISH CHAIRMAN BARRY DAVOLLS

### Precept

Following my article in the February Eye edition, I can now confirm that the provisional figures previously stated have now been finalised without any changes. To re-cap, as a result of the increase to Lopen PC's budget together with the impact of the local council tax benefit scheme, the cost of a band D charge has increased by approximately £4 per annum in relation to the precept alone.

### Defibrillator for Lopen

I am pleased to announce that Somerset County Council has issued to LPC a grant of £1200 towards the cost of a defibrillator for the village and the PC would like to express their thanks to Cllr. Paul Maxwell for securing this on our behalf. Les Farris has agreed to work with the PC on the project to get the unit up and running with trained responders from the village. It was Les' original idea and the PC would like to thank him for this and his future input. The Parish Council will also be applying for a top-up grant from the British Heart Foundation towards the costs of providing the equipment, training and running costs.

### Speed Indicator Device (SID)

The January report for the speed indicator device for traffic headed north delivered typical results, both in respect of numbers of vehicles passing through the village and the alarmingly high proportion that were speeding. Unfortunately, the southbound installation scheduled for the end of January was aborted due to difficulties resulting from the bad weather. Our next installation dates are during May for both north and southbound flows.

### South Somerset Local Plan now submitted

The South Somerset Local Plan (SSLP) 2006-2028 (previously known as the core strategy) is now in the final stages of adoption having been submitted by the District Council to the Planning Inspector for public examination before, if all goes well, approval and adoption later this year.

Several last minute changes have been made to the proposed plan following the final public consultation held during the summer of last year.

There is a provision in the plan to allow rural settlements (such as Lopen) to grow where growth is both sustainable and has the backing of the local community.

For Lopen, as we are divorced from almost all key services, poor sustainability is likely to rule out any significant development within the village whether we want it or not. In theory at least, this includes both commercial and housing development.

South Petherton's allocation has been revised to provide a total of 229 houses over the plan period to 2028 which, allowing for existing completions and allocations, leaves around 78 houses yet to be permitted along with 2 hectares of commercial land.

### Village Picnic

At our January meeting it was agreed that a village picnic will be held this year at some point over the August bank holiday weekend. The exact day, times and venue have yet to be finalised. Carolyn White has kindly agreed to Chair the picnic committee on which Peggie Finlayson will be representing the Parish Council. Further details to be announced.

## LOPEN TO RECEIVE ITS OWN LIFE-SAVING DEVICE

Funding for a portable defibrillator has been obtained by the Parish Council. This is the equipment seen in many medical programmes on the TV. It uses an electric shock to restart a heart in the event of a serious heart attack or to jolt it back into a regular rhythm should the rhythm become irregular. Prompt use of a defibrillator while waiting for an ambulance to arrive can save a life. It's as simple as that.



A big thank-you to Cllr. Paul Maxwell and Somerset County Council for providing £1,200 to purchase this equipment from the British Heart Foundation.

A team of volunteers from different areas of the village will be recruited and trained to use the equipment under expert guidance.

## BUS ROUTE THROUGH LOPEN UNDER THREAT AGAIN - VOLUNTEER TRANSPORT SCHEMES COULD BE THE ANSWER

Parish Councillor Peggie Finlayson has offered to co-ordinate a volunteer transport scheme in Lopen for villagers lacking their own car.

**Please call Peggie on 240 059 if either you need this service yourself or would be prepared to become a volunteer driver.**



Alternatively, South Somerset Association for Voluntary and Community Action has an existing scheme, who say; *"This service is provided by volunteer drivers in their own vehicles. Therefore it is not suitable for wheelchair users. Our community cars scheme is available for local people who have difficulty using public transport or who have no access to public transport. The scheme operates similarly to a taxi service but you will be driven by one of our friendly volunteer drivers in their own cars. Whilst there is a minimal charge for using our service (to cover the mileage costs for our volunteers) it is considerably cheaper than local taxi services. Ideally you will book our service in advance by at least 48 hours to ensure we are able to match an available driver to your individual journey needs."* Call them on 01935 411 572 or email: [transport@SSVCA.org.uk](mailto:transport@SSVCA.org.uk)
