The Chesterfield Canal Trust is a charitable company run entirely by volunteers, incorporated in July 1997. It took over from the Chesterfield Canal Society which had been founded in 1976.

The aims of the Trust are to promote the full restoration and appropriate development of the Chesterfield Canal, and to campaign for the construction of the Rother Valley Link, a navigable waterway to join the Chesterfield Canal to the Sheffield and South Yorkshire Navigation.

Amongst other activities, we run four trip boats -Seth Ellis in Retford, Hugh Henshall in Worksop, Madeline at Hollingwood Hub and John Varley in Chesterfield. We also have an 90 year old ex-working boat called Python that attends waterways festivals and does canal clean-ups. Some volunteers have built Dawn Rose, the first new Cuckoo boat for 90 years, using traditional methods and hand tools.

Our promotional trailer, the James Brindley, travels far and wide informing people about the canal. There are Volunteer Work Parties on the canal every weekend and often during the week. Our office is at Hollingwood Hub, which includes Katey's Coffee Shop.

We have well over 1,800 members, who receive copies of our awardwinning magazine Cuckoo and regular E-Newsletters. In addition there are meetings, social events and lots of other volunteering opportunities. Membership is available via our website, which is a mine of information about the canal.

I have been researching and leading walks along the Chesterfield Canal for over twenty years. The canal is an absolute delight at any time of year, but early Autumn possibly sees it at its best.

The Chesterfield Canal has featured in many Walking Festivals in the past, but last year the Trust decided run its own Walking Festival.

The results were amazing. We had over 50 walks and over 500 participants - so we decided to do it again this year.

We believe that this is the biggest Walking Festival along a single canal. We are very grateful to everyone who has helped us to put it together.

There are special interest walks, e.g. Nature, History, Architecture and Restoration. There are also opportunities to explore some of the attractive towns and villages in North Nottinghamshire.

We are delighted to be able to offer a Tree, Mushroom and Toadstool walk with Dr Patrick Harding, one of the country's leading experts in fungi.

We will be repeating our full-length walk of the canal (46 miles) in three days. This time we are going east to west - from the River Trent to the centre of Chesterfield.

There are opportunities to combine a walk (a good choice available, from 2 or 3 miles up to 7), with a cruise on our trip boats.

We are even offering the opportunity of a guided tour of Britain's last surviving working Railway Roundhouse at Barrow Hill.

So, feast your eyes on all the possibilities and we hope to see you on the canal in September.



Boats & Boots

Combine a boat trip with a walk - what better way to explore an area? Each trip will include going up or down in at least one lock and the walks range from a two mile towpath saunter to a seven mile exploration of the local countryside. You may even have the opportunity to steer the boat - under strict supervision of course!

Our tripboat John Varley II will run from Tapton Lock in Chesterfield - Walks 40 and 41.

Hugh Henshall from Shireoaks (near Worksop) – Walks 22, 25, 36 and 38.

Seth Ellis from Retford - Walks 5, 9, 48 and 52.

These trips are very popular and the boat capacity is limited to just 12 on each trip, so early booking is advisable. We charge for these walks to cover the costs of the boats.



Full length walk

We expect this walk to be very popular, so we can only accept bookings from those who wish to walk all three sections. We will not accept bookings for single sections.

Please bring a packed lunch and plenty to drink. There will be toilet stops along the way, but there will not be time to relax in cafés!

On Tuesday, 18th September, the group will cover the 15 miles from West Stockwith to Retford to through Misterton, Drakeholes and Clayworth.

On Wednesday, 19th September, the group will cover 16 miles from Retford to Kiveton Park through Ranby and Worksop. This will include the delightful Giant's Staircase of 22 locks in just over a mile.

On Thursday 20th September, the group will cover 15 miles from Kiveton Park to Chesterfield. This will include 9 miles along the restoration route through Killamarsh and Renishaw, and 6 miles along the restored canal and the River Rother.

We will be able to arrange lifts from the finish points



to the starts for a few walkers, but otherwise walkers are expected to organise their own transport. West Stockwith is on bus routes 97 and 98. Retford and Kiveton Park have rail stations.

An exhibition of photographs

We know that many of you will have a camera with you on our walks and so we propose to hold an exhibition of photos taken during our Festival.

The exhibition will be held at the Trust's headquarters at Hollingwood Hub in Staveley initially, and hopefully in a few local libraries later.

Photographs can be taken on or off the canal and might include boats, buildings and structures,

all kinds of wildlife, good views and scenery; in fact anything that catches your eye. See our website for all the Terms and Conditions.



Bookings

All walks must be booked in advance.

You can book online via the Chesterfield Canal Trust website: www.chesterfield-canal-trust.org.uk. This will link you to the Chesterfield Visitor Information Centre's booking website.

You can also book by phone on 01246 345777 or in person at the Visitor Information Centre, which is next to the Crooked Spire in Rykneld Square, Chesterfield, S40 1SB.

All the walks are free except for Boats & Boots (5, 9, 48 & 52), Walks 2, 11 and 43, for which there will be a collection on the day by the walk leaders for their organisations, and Walk 7 which includes a meal. However, the Chesterfield Canal Trust will pay a fee to Chesterfield VIC for taking all the bookings. Walk leader will take a voluntary collection. The money will go to pay this fee. Any extra monies will go towards the Chesterfield Canal Trust's Restoration Fund.

Numbers

Some walks have strictly limited numbers, e.g. 12 for all Boats & Boots, so it is a good idea to book early.

Preparing for your walk

Walkers are expected to make their own transport arrangements. The start points of most walks are close to rail stations and/or bus services, see below.

Please try to arrive at least 15 minutes before the stated set off time to get registered and have a briefing. Walk leaders will not keep everyone else waiting if you are late.

Please wear suitable clothing, especially decent boots. Some paths, including towpaths, are likely to be muddy. It is always wise to wear several layers and to bring a waterproof jacket. A drink is also a good idea.

Refreshments

Most walks start or finish near pubs or cafés. On long walks, it is a good idea to bring a packed lunch. This is a requirement of a few walks, notably the Full Length Walk - see the symbols at the bottom of the walk descriptions.

Accessibility

The majority of walks are not wheelchair or pushchair friendly because they cross fields, stiles etc. The exceptions are the Children's Walk (45), and Boats & Boots - Walks 40 and 41. Toilets

Toilets

Please note there will not be public toilets on the route of most of the walks.

Public transport

There are rail stations in Chesterfield, Kiveton, Kiveton Park, Shireoaks, Worksop and Retford. **Useful bus services are:**

90 from Chesterfield to Staveley via Tapton Lock and Hollingwood Hub.

78 from Chesterfield Station and Town Centre to Staveley Town Basin.

70 from Chesterfield to Sheffield via Staveley, Renishaw, Eckington and Killamarsh.

26 from Rotherham to South Anston, meeting the canal on Rotherham Road in Killamarsh and Kiveton Park. It also links up with Sheffield Supertram at Crystal Peaks.

7 from Shireoaks along the canal into Worksop.

42/43 from Worksop to Retford via Manton and Ranby.

97 from Retford to Gainsborough right along the canal via Clayworth, Clarborough, Hayton, Wiseton, Gringley-on-the-Hill, Walkeringham, Misterton and West Stockwith.

98 from Gainsborough to Doncaster via Gringley-onthe-Hill, Misterton and West Stockwith.

Walk gradings

Gentle

Short walks on flat ground or very gentle gradients. No stiles.

Easy

Walks for reasonably fit people. There may be gentle gradients and stiles.

Moderate


Walks for people with a good level of fitness. There may be some steep gradients and stiles.

Strenuous

Long walks, suitable for regular walkers with a good level of fitness. There may be gradients and stiles. The walk may be taken at a brisk pace.

Derbyshire

Visitors are often surprised to find that the first part of the canal, close to Chesterfield Railway Station, actually uses the River Rother. It will shortly be linked to the huge new Waterside development by a new lock. After a short distance, the towpath passes weirs and a floodgate and the man-made canal - now fully restored for five miles - begins. There's a Visitor Centre and small café at Tapton Lock where a trip boat operates.

The canal follows an attractive green corridor, part nature reserve, which belies its industrial past. The Chesterfield Canal Trust has its headquarters at Hollingwood Hub, where there is a popular Coffee Shop overlooking the lock. It's the base for another trip boat.

At Staveley, a basin and new lock have been built, with further developments planned. Restoration work is under way for a short distance beyond. This is a hugely popular section with walkers and cyclists - well worth a visit.

The unrestored nine miles

Staveley to Kiveton Park presents several big challenges, but they are all resolvable and the Chesterfield Canal Trust aims to see restoration completed by 2027. Although there are only occasional signs of the canal, and very little water, the route can be followed along public rights of way and is an interesting and enjoyable walk.

The route crosses the River Doe Lea, then goes on to Renishaw, where some restoration has taken place, but there's no suitable water supply to keep it topped up. Next is Killamarsh, where a complex new route around the town is being considered, which will take the canal through a lake in Rother Valley Country Park. Flights of new locks, or possibly a boat lift, will be required before the hidden gem at Norwood - a former canal maintenance village and pub. From here, 13 locks will be restored to take the canal up to the long Norwood Tunnel. The plan is to use part of the tunnel, but also more locks and a cutting.

Next is Kiveton Waters, a restored colliery site where ponds have been constructed, currently used for fishing but ready and waiting to become a marina. A short distance further on lies the eastern portal of the Norwood Tunnel. The canal is fully restored from here to the River Trent.

Kiveton to Shireoaks

This section, mainly in rural South Yorkshire, really is a 'must see' - and one that's always worth returning to. A fully restored canal starts at the bricked up eastern portal of Norwood Tunnel. This is its highest point, so it is referred to as the summit pound.

The towpath follows this pound through woodland, then, at Thorpe Locks, begins a dramatic descent through 23 locks, some in staircases, down to Nottinghamshire and the colourful basin at Shireoaks. On the way it passes through the picturesque hamlet of Turnerwood, a photographer's dream. On either side there are attractive paths - to the Britain in Bloom award winning village of Thorpe Salvin on one side and lovely Lindrick Dale on the other.

This section is frequently referred to as one of the most beautiful stretches of canal in the country, and so we have included several opportunities in the programme for you to explore the area.

North Nottinghamshire

The canal is a real delight from Worksop to the River Trent - long quiet stretches with wide views over the rich farmland. Because the land is level, there are very few locks, however they are wider and capable of taking two boats side by side. Retford is a fine town, with its large market square dominated by the French style Town Hall. Attractive villages close to the canal, like Hayton and Clarborough, are waiting to be explored. There are always plenty of boats to see around Clayworth.

Gringley-on-the-Hill has a fine old church and you can see for miles from Beacon Hill, one of the highest places in the county. West Stockwith has its pubs, Dutch style buildings and the large basin where the canal joins the mighty Trent.

1 Clayworth

The Chesterfield Canal meanders around the village, bringing with it an array of interesting wildlife and an insight to life on the water. We take a short diversion to the heart of the village to visit the picturesque St. Peter's Church; the home of the world famous Traquair Murals which are the largest pieces of ecclesiastic art work in the East of England. The church tower houses a ring of eight bells, the oldest dating back to 1629. Clayworth has changed very little over the years, with pretty cottages and two pubs in a traditional rural setting. It has much to offer, set alongside the sleepy canal and this super little walk captures traditional village life at its best.

We will head out from Harthill across the fields to Thorpe Salvin and then down to the canal. We will then follow the canal to Kiveton Park, returning via Kiveton Community Woodland to Harthill village.

3 Historic Churches Walk

There will be the chance to visit four beautiful historic rural churches and support Nottinghamshire Historic Churches Trust Ride and Stride (https:// www.rideandstrideuk.org/counties/nottinghamshire). We will start at St Mary's Georgian church in West Stockwith before joining the canal at the basin. After walking to Misterton, visiting Grade I listed All Saints' Parish Church with its Piper window, we will rejoin the canal, heading to Gringley-on-the-Hill with the chance to visit St Peter and St Paul's Parish Church at the top of the hill. Back to the canal, we follow the towpath to St Peter's Parish Church in Clayworth to see the amazing Traquair Murals. An art exhibition is planned here, so you can relax at the end of your walk.

5 Boats & Boots from Retford on Seth Ellis

We will then go to Clarborough, passing St John the Baptist Church, which dates back to 1260. Another ascent will take us on to The Baulk for sweeping views west towards Retford, before heading back to the Hop Pole.

7 Babworth

The small, but quintessentially English hamlet of Babworth was the birthplace of the Pilgrim Fathers, who were the early settlers of Plymouth, Massachusetts and founders of the New World. All Saints Church dates back over 900 years and has significant connections to the Pilgrim story. The final stretch of our walk takes us over field edge tracks, ancient woodland and by road, where we follow in the footsteps of Dick Turpin, before joining the Chesterfield Canal. We stop for a special 'Posh Picnic' supplied by baRnby's of Blyth (cost applies) before returning to Babworth.

B Hollingwood, Staveley and Poolsbrook Country Park


