

Dear People,

I love November. The autumn colours are still bright in the sun, and the evergreens remind us that spring will come after the winter. And the beauty of autumn is reflected in the beauty of the prayer of the Church, because this is the month when we are reminded to remember our loved ones with God and to prav with and for them.

All Saints and Holy Souls are the first two days of the prayerful celebration - and we remember the same people on those two days! Our loved ones with God, yet still aware of the regrets they have for how they might have lived more generously, more lovingly, for God and for those whom God had given them in family, friendships, neighbourhood, society, etc. This regret we used to call Purgatory . . .

Now we say "Purifying". Did you, do you, think of Purgatory as a place? The old catechism answer, which many of you will have learned, talked of it as a place or a state - meaning a state of mind and heart. The Church does not speak of it now as a place, as we learned most recently again in one of the books by Pope Benedict XVI on the life of Jesus of Nazareth.

In that book Pope Benedict speaks of coming before Christ at the hour of death and knowing the fullness of love that our Saviour and Redeemer has for each of us. In that purifying love we are forgiven, but deeply aware of the hurt love that we had offended by not loving generously enough in our life on earth. In the presence of Christ we are purified.

It is a beautiful image. It was given us as students for the priesthood in the 1960s as a coming before God and knowing the fullness of God's love. In that new understanding how deeply we shall regret not having lived better lives. That regret is purifying love, and those of you who have shared it in moments of family and friendship love, where there had been deep hurt and now there is genuine forgiveness, will know what hurt there is in being forgiven.

Purgatory, purifying: it is what our loved ones know in the presence of God. We pray for them and tell them we love them.


