Dear People,

Today is World Mission Day. Around the world the Catholic Church prays for blessing on our missionaries, especially in the developing world.

At the back of the church are envelopes for those who would like to contribute to Missio and its work. We have had several mission appeals during the year, so I would feel awkward in imposing another one - but I'm glad to offer the opportunity to contribute to those who would like to.

In today's first reading at mass we have part of a wonderful poem about the Servant of God who is willing to serve and die for God and the people. He is a wonderful symbol of our good missionaries who are willing to go anywhere and give themselves completely for God and the people. Two of my brethren were like that. Here is what I wrote about them for our "Lord's Day" newsletter.

Father Edmund Spillane and Father Gerard Smith are the names of two missionary friends. As young men they were sent to Tanzania and devoted their lives to the peoples of that country. Father Edmund is now in his eighties, frail enough to be able to return home and spend his final years quietly: but his longing was to be with his people in Africa, and finally to die there. The mission hospital, which has been his latest project, will stay as a wonderful memorial to him. Father Gerard died a couple of years ago, in Tanzania. It was his will. Some years ago he came back to Britain for a serious operation. He said he was not afraid to die if the operation did not succeed - his only fear was not going back to Africa if the operation were successful and his religious congregation wanted him to stay in Britain! To be separated from the people he had come to love would have been for him a living death.

These two fine men remind us, on Mission Sunday, of the many who have offered their lives to serve God's people in mission lands. They discover that in their service of love they become one with the people with whom they live. We remember them today with gratitude - and the many fine people at home who support them by fundraising and prayer.

Many of you will know, or know of, good men and women who have gone to other lands to bring God's love. We pray for them all. They inspire us.
