Dear People,

This is the last full week of the world's history. It has been good sharing it with you but on 21st December, we are told from an ancient Mayan calendar, the world will come to an end.

You smile. But on 22nd December, it seems, some people will not be smiling. On an unusual website, naturalnews.com, we are told that people are spending lavishly on their credit cards believing that they will not have to face the consequences. It would be easy to ridicule such spending, but we know how gullible people can be, including us.

We pray for those for whom the dawn of 22nd December will be an unpleasant shock. For some years now the "prophecies" have been made - just as in past ages - and some people have believed. Can you remember earlier years and people waiting expectantly for the end of the world? For some that day is 21.12.2012. We wait for 22.12.2012.

Have ever heard "I don't go to church, it's full of hypocrites"? An answer might be "There's always room for one more." But if someone were to say "I don't go to church because it's full of sinners," a worthwhile answer might be "that's why we're there."

"Christian churches are not, as a rule, model communities of good behaviour. They are, rather, places where human misbehaviour is faced and dealt with. Just as a hospital collects the sick under one roof and labels them as such, the church collects sinners. Many of the people outside the hospitals are as sick as those inside, but their illnesses are either undiagnosed or disguised."

That quotation comes from Eugene Petersen in an introduction to the Letter of St James in the New Testament of the Bible. St James' letter shows an apostle dealing with areas of misbelief and misbehaviour in the congregations committed to his care. St James prayed for the wisdom to guide his people. We all need something of that wisdom - parents, friends, colleagues, teachers, etc.

We pray for God's guidance and good advisers.
