News from Lourdes

Thank you all for your prayers during this unsettled time.

Tuesday 18th June started just like any other day - rain, rain and yes, more rain. The river had been swollen and a cause for concern for a while, but only when I reached St. Michael's Gate did I have a real awareness that this was not a normal wet day; the gate was half closed with a notice stating that the Sanctuary was closed. After mass I went home and watched the road become a river of thick brown muddy water. This was the second time in eight months that this renowned Marian shrine was to be plunged into a catastrophic state. We all watched as the water levels rose.

But out of sight was the real devastation as the Underground Basilica became a massive ocean of the same foul water, to the depths of 3.5 metres (about 10 feet). Residing so near to the Sanctuary it was impossibe to not hear and see the events unfold as the Emergency Services were stretched to capacity. Soon after 6pm the electricity supply was cut and remained so until 11.30 am the following morning.

All services at ground level were cancelled or transferred to a higher level. The visible damage was soul destroying. The relatively newly surfaced bridge was destroyed, the ironwork bent and twisted; the Prairie was afloat with tree trunks, branches and foliage - and yet again the baths a mass of flattened debis! Had there been a tornado I don't think it could have looked worse and all this floating on a sea of water. The hoteliers have been badly hit again with those along Ave du Paradis suffering worse than most, as it is these that were worst hit last October and therefore unable to claim again on their insurance. Hotel 'Les Arcades' hadn't even had their work completed.

By the grace of God there was no shortage of voluntary hands to assist in the mass clearup and the Sanctuary was re-opened within days and the Grotto the following afternoon. The river has once again become a foul colour and many of us are still not feeling any too easy. I think that by tomorrow some of the roads which have beeen closed to traffic may be reopened, but of course the financial cost to both the Sanctuary and the town will be colossal. The damage in October was more than two million euros, which has been paid, so the cost this time will be fearful!
