Dear People,

Over the years I have heard the following story occasionally. This week it is from the author Maurice Baring:

"One doctor said to another doctor: 'About the termination of a pregnancy, I want your opinion. The father suffered from syphilis and the mother from tuberculosis. Of the four children born, the first was blind, the second died, the third was deaf and dumb, the fourth also suffered tuberculosis. What would you have done?'

'I would have ended the pregnancy.' 'Then you would have killed Beethoven.'

The power of the story seems to be that a great composer was born into such a family, but I always feel uneasy that the story seems to suggest people should not die if they are gifted and any child in the womb might be wonderfully gifted. But surely the value of life is not in the giftedness of the person but rather in the child being a child?

I write this as a consequence of the storm that you might have caught from Professor Dawkins' talking about children in the womb being diagnosed with Downs Syndrome. The secular and religious press have criticised him for suggesting that such a diagnosis should lead to an abortion: "It would be immoral to bring it into the world if you have the choice," he said.

Many people from the pro-choice community, and those with loved ones who have the genetic condition, were enraged by what Dawkins said. The professor has since posted a lengthy explanation on his personal website, including "I apologise for impugning the morality of the aproximately 10% of women who deliberately choose NOT to abort a Downs' fetus."

From the beginning of the arguments about the life of the child in the womb we have heard many opinions. What is yours?

I remember my aunt looking after a young girl who was pregnant. I was too young to understand then but later I did: her family wanted her out of the house and she would only be able to return home if she gave the baby for adoption. I'm grateful for the loving example of my aunt but disturbed that families were so cruel. A child in the womb is alive and loved. We all were. God was there.

This letter was memorised by a fellow captive for James Foley, the American photojournalist beheaded last week. It was James' last letter home to his family. We discover that he loved saying the Rosary and that he saw his journalism as a way of serving God and the world - sharing the truth of suffering as far as he could.

We know that Pope Francis telephoned the Foley family to comfort them and John and Diane, James Foley's parents, said how comforted and supported they felt.
