Dear People,

You will be pleased to hear praise of the Church in this week's Catholic press. A former director at the World Bank says: "As a result of its work in basic health and education in the last fifty years the Catholic Church has probably lifted more people out of poverty than any other civic institution in history.

"In some African countries, as much as half of basic education and health services are provided by the Church. Catholic hospitals and clinics around the world distribute about a third of all the antiretroviral drugs received by people living with HIV and AIDS; and in India, where Catholic are no more than 2% of the population, the Church is the second-largest care provider in this area after the government . . .

"Many of the Pope's statements have been highly arresting: he has attacked the idolatry of money and called unchecked capitalism 'a new tyranny.' His trenchant criticique of trickle-down economics has earned the anger of conservative commentators.

"Pope Francis has stressed that serving the poor and promoting social justice are central to the Church's identity and mission. He has renewed the hope of Catholic activists that faith and charity can go hand in hand." (Robert Calderisi)

In another article about 'Modern Slavery' Pope Francis is praised as the strongest voice in our world in speaking out for the human dignity of every person. How good to have the Pope and the Church recognised for their voices for the world.

In our children's liturgy, the prayers the children bring us often carry the theme of concern for others - family, friends, children and their families around the world. How good to hear our children growing in awareness of the world in which they are growing up, their hearts being opened to seeing everyone as brother and sister in God's human family. We are grateful for such guidance.
