Realistically, I can't expect to live more than another thirty years. What can I do for God in that time? Carry on as far as I can, days structured on prayer and service to the people, and always aware of how much more I might do . . .

An old priest, in a bad mood and renowned for his sharp tongue, told me when I was in my 40's that I was a has-been who had only ever been a nobody. I enjoyed that - the sharp wit, clever phrasing, and I've treasured it in my memories of him. It was he who gave me my first book of prayers for giving the sacraments to the sick at home and in hospital. It was that book I used when I anointed him in his final sickness, and I enjoy remembering him every time I use that book. And the insult. I still enjoy that. A has-been who was only ever a nobody.

Is that you? Would people sum you up like that? Who remembers you where you went to work, used to live? Who is proud of knowing or having known you? Has your life been quiet and uneventful, or dull and repetitive?

What have you done about it? What are you going to do? Trundle through the coming years or make something beautiful of the glorious time that God gives us.

Philosophers and common sense tell us of the newness of each day and that we all have the same gift of the same time. Some use it wonderfully, others don't - we have the choice. Do you vary your days?

Today you might read of the wonder of the skies, marvelling with astronomers at the immensity of God's creation. You might read the background to the news of the day - conflicts in the Middle East, the history of Islam, the creating of the countries of our world. You might read of the Church, its sad and glorious history, the present problems and discussions, the sparkling new leadership being given by Pope Francis.

And all bound together by prayer - morning and night blessing - and moments during the day. At work or school the gratitude for much to do, gladness for the people you know in the security of home. You could telephone or write to someone who is lonely or housebound, even visit. You could offer help where you know help would be appreciated.

Loving family, prayer, good reading, kind thoughts and deeds, awareness of our sad and wonderful world, of the beauty of creation around and above us. And all the time gratitude to God for being alive.

GIFT AID UPDATE

This is an important message to all those who give money to the Church and have made a Gift Aid Declaration.

In order to be valid, your Gift Aided donation to the Church, when added to all of the other donations you make under a Gift Aid Declaration, must not exceed the part of your income subject to tax.

Example: If you earn £12,500 per year, then, after the new £10,000 tax allowance rate is deducted, you can only Gift Aid the tax paid on £2,500. If you earn under £10,000 per year then there is no tax paid to Gift Aid.

Dear Parish and School of St Joseph's. MOTHER OF PEACE COMMUNITY

On my return from Zimbabwe, I was telling you about the crisis at MOP concerning the children's uniforms. They make their own for their primary school, but as the children grow older, they will be unable to progress elsewhere unless they are appropriately dressed. I saw children in tears with worry.

There are currently 25 Year-7 children, by far the largest age group, as the AIDS pandemic reached its peak around 14 years ago.

Well, I counted the remaining donations re the Easter project, prayer requests for Chigona etc.and found we had £431.86. I also asked St. Joseph's school whether they could help, as they have before...and guess what, the children did a sponsored walk, raising £1,520.62 Amazina!

So I have just banked £1.952.48 for MOP. What a wonderful parish and school! Thank you, thank you, again and again. I wish you could see what it will mean to the children. They have their dreams just like us; their reality is so much harsher.

We will continue to support "our" children's schooling and maybe even tertiary education? I would be interested to hear what you would think about a Fr. David scholarship?
