Dear People,

Are you going to Wales again for your holiday this year? You must go to Tenby, a delightful little town with fine sandy beaches and surrounded by beautiful countryside. Just across the water is Caldey Island - the real reason for going to Tenby.

I have spent several times on the island, preaching retreats and staying in the guest house. The monks are most welcoming, and you may stay in the monastery itself or in any of the other properties on the island. In the Catholic press this week is a pleasant picture of life on the island and in the monastery.

One of the monks says: "It's all here. There are gannets, falcons, peregrines, finches, songbirds, robins, goldcrests, long tails. You've got nature, supernature, the peace, the sea, and Jesus Christ as well."

And whom will you meet? The community of monks, aged from 55 to 95, diverse personalities with diverse backgrounds. One was a Formula One racing driver, another read modern languages at Cambridge, then worked in the City. Another was a medical doctor and a founder of HCPT (the Handicapped Children's Pilgrimage Trust), another was a lawyer, and Fr Daniel, the abbot, composed much of the music used in the Divine Office, the daily prayer of priests.

Can you see why I am teasing you? Those men were all successful and happy in their full lives, but were willing to sacrifice all to find God in the peace of monastic life, a whole day dedicated to prayer and quiet work. The glorious invitation in the Christian life is that we can find the same peace - although in different settings. We set the time aside for God, and the inspiration of that time fills everything we do, enriching all our work and recreation and activities.

That men and women choose a monastic life is not surprising because they have discovered that in the depths of everything they wanted God. They inspire us to seek the same loving God.

If you go to Wales, stay on the island for a short holiday, you will share that peace. But you could go anywhere and take your peace with you.

A letter in this week's Tablet.

"I live in Oxford, where, working for many years in sexual health, I was increasingly witness to practices in the Muslim community which were clear and unequivocal rejection of the values and laws we take for granted here. Whether forced marriage, domestic violence, female genital mutilation, or female patients attending the clinic not being allowed to be seen without their husbands, and most recently the fallout from the abuse of vulnerable girls by Asian men in the city, what I saw, I believe, was what happens when Islam is unchallenged by a society. One has only to look at practically any continent now to see the consequences of unfettered Islam: whether the plight of Christian minorities or women and children, this is the direction of travel for all who espouse sharia law; indeed, it should be noticed that in this country we already have over 100 sharia courts which have been shown to contradict or ignore both British law and justice as understood by all of us working to best practice within the health and social sectors, particularly with women."

Fr John writes: Mr Cole writes his letter as part of the debate about those who stigmatise those who practice the Muslim faith. Where do you stand on this now world issue? The horror of what is happening in Northern Iraq where the inspiration of ISIS demands the execution of anyone deemed an apostate or infidel - and this includes moderate Muslims, and the entire Shia and Kurdish populations.

Our world politicians are facing a terrible dilemma. the whole peace and stability of that region is under threat.

We are all involved. Many of us have good Muslim neighbours and friends who would be condemned with us by extremists. We pray that God will guide us in the free world to bring justice and peace.
