

Dear People,

Our pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi was wonderful. Forty-eight people came from around the country as well as locally from Leicester. We blended beautifully into a happy and prayerful group and people were commenting how good to make new friends in the setting of a pilgrimage.

We began in Assisi with mass at the Basilica of St Francis. Our hotel was ideally placed for walks and views around Assisi and over the landscape of Umbria. We were very near St Francis' Basilica and were able to visit several times and had mass with the community and other pilgrims early in the morning and again in the evening.

We walked the fascinating little streets of the town, visiting St Clare's, the Cathedral, several small churches and shared the lovely atmosphere of Assisi that is always part of the welcome. The spirit of St Francis and St Clare is so alive, as it has been down the centuries. Assisi loves its two saints and shares that love with the pilgrims who come.

One evening we went to see the musical "Chiara di Dio" (Clare of God) which we had seen in previous visits, but this was the best. The applause at the end told the cast just how good we thought they were. A crowded theatre allowed them to respond with gratitude for our appreciation. The actors explained to us who they are: a community of young people, bound by prayer and dedication and sharing several years of giving their lives to God. They asked us to pray for them.

Our journey to Rome started sadly as we had left the happiness of Assisi, but the wonder of Rome captivated us immediately. The first evening we had mass at St Peter's at the main altar, other days we were allowed our own celebration in English in beautiful chapels down in the crypt. We began many of our visits with prayer in the churches and wound our way through Church Rome, Ancient Rome, a vibrant capital city in six full days. It was everything we wanted. We prayed for family, friends and parishes.

But for the first time this year we saw beautiful scrolls with a general blessing from Pope Francis and his smiling photograph.
