Dear People,

Today is Sea Sunday, when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea. Without them we would not have most of the items we buy in the shops. Today's second collection is for the Apostleship of the Sea, the Church's official maritime welfare agency. It supports seafarers both practically and spiritually.

The annual collection is vital to enable it to continue its work, and is always held on the second Sunday in July. Please give generously today and remember seafarers in your prayers.

There are envelopes available at the back of church if you would like to make a further donation and on the envelope, as on the notices in the church porch, you will see a smiling lady. She is Sister Marian Davey and is the chaplain at the port of Felixstowe. Look at the smile on her face and admire her hard hat. There is a story told of her in the Apostleship magazine - of how she stood up for three sailors who had been badly treated by the management. Sadly, we know how hard conditions can be at sea and how wages can be delayed and the hardship this can mean for the sailors' families, especially in the poorer parts of the world. Sister Marian stood up for them. Good for her.

When I was in South Wales I saw the work of the Apostleship in the Cardiff and Newport docks, and have always admired that work: welcoming the sailors in their short time ashore, looking after their welfare both spiritual and practical - providing them with meals and a place to relax and feel at home. The life of a merchant sailor is hard, months at a time away from the family. We pray for the sailors and the work of the Apostleship of the Sea.

Over the page you will read a letter from Bishop Patrick. With all the bishops he is concerned about the Bill being introduced in parliament in September. Please read and consider if you would like to be directly involved by writing to your MP.

Next week there will be an outline of the Bishops' statement on assisted dying. It is full of concern and consideration for those seriously ill. We pray. God bless us,
