Dear People,

You may have read these words in the last week: "No union is more profound than marriage, for it embodies the highest ideals of love, fidelity, devotion, sacrifice and family. In forming a marital union, two people become something greater than once they were. As some of the petitioners in these cases demonstrate, marriage embodies a love that may endure even past death. It would misunderstand these men and women to say they disrespect the idea of marriage. Their plea is that they do respect it, respect it so deeply that they seek to find its fulfilment for themselves. Their hope is not to be condemned to live in loneliness, excluded from one of civilisations' oldest institutions. They ask for equal dignity in the eyes of the law. The (American) Constitution grants them that right."

The words were spoken by Justice Anthony Kennedy when he and the other members of the Supreme Court of the United States declared samesex marriage to be according to the Constitution.

The Court voted 5-4 in favour of granting the right. Did you know that six of the nine members of the Supreme Court are practising Catholics? This will explain, in part, the anger of some of the American bishops that the declaration is not in accordance with the teachings of the Catholic Church.

We have seen often enough in our own country, and can presume it happens in all countries where there is freedom to live one's faith, that political decisions need to be made according to conscience - that sometimes do not seem to fit with the tenets of the politicians' faith or church.

How would you stand if you were a member of Parliament, or a member of the Supreme Court? Would you consult the bishops, your conscience, and how would you explain your decision to the people who elected or appointed you?

We pray for those in public office. There must be times when they feel great tension. The Catholic members of Hitler's war cabinet, 1939-45: how did they accept the Holocaust, the Final Solution "to kill and destroy the Jewish race". Was there ever a more horrifying decision made in civilisation? A new understanding of marriage seems very small in comparison. Is it?

We pray for understanding for ourselves and for those in public office.

Every school needs a strong and dedicated governing body. St Joseph's Academy, our own local Catholic school, is in need of new governors.


We are looking for volunteers who are interested in Catholic education and are willing to dedicate time to help the school.
