The Catholic press this week is full of comment, for and against, what Pope Francis has said. It is fascinating to see how the same words can be interpreted so differently. I hope you have considered prayerfully what the Pope has said: it is essentially a cry for the poor, a cry for the earth.

On Friday, 3rd July, Bishop Patrick will be ordained as Bishop of our diocese. What a joyful occasion for the priests and people and for him. He has spoken of his happiness at being chosen. We pray for him and welcome him - ready for his visit to St Joseph's as we await our turn in his fine pastoral plan: to visit every parish of the diocese!

I shall be in Cardiff that day, celebrating the 48th anniversary of my first mass in my home parish church where I was ordained on the 2nd July, 1967. On Thursday, 2nd July, the anniversary of my ordination, I shall say mass at St Joseph's and then travel to Cardiff. What blessed two days: celebration at St Joseph's and at home. Please pray for me.

Please pray, also, for our Sisters of St Joseph of Peace. There are changes in the convent, as a number of you have noticed. We heard from the people of Rearsby a little while ago that the Sisters had made a public announcement that they were moving from Rearsby and the Sisters would be living in the smaller convents around the country.

I was asked to say nothing then, but now it seems good to prepare to welcome the elderly Sisters soon to arrive and to rejoice that Sister Lelia will continue her wonderful parish and city apostolic work from St Joseph's. An area of our hall is being dedicated to this work and you may have noticed the necessary ongoing movements. We pray for the Sisters in this time of adjustment - but how sad they are leaving Rearsby after all these years.

I heard a man speak of being brought up in a mother and baby home, of the loneliness he and others suffered in the home itself and at the local school where they were shunned and despised. He wondered about his young mother whose family refused to accept him as her baby and had him put away in a home to hide the shame from the neighbours.

How can religious people be so cruel? How can the world understand such so-called religious attitudes?

When we look at our Christian history martyrdoms, wars, divisions, neighbourhoods torn apart, and see our own share in the horror of religous persecutions and separation, can we wonder that the world sometimes tells us that we religious people have little to offer society because we are judgemental, narrow and arrogant.

With Pope Francis we seem to be entering an age of humble understanding. We pray that we be as God wants us to be. And then we look at the horror of the Middle East and wonder what sort of religious fervour that is.
