An invitation from Bishop Patrick to all young adults throughout the Nottingham Diocese.

"Sunday 20 November 2016 is the Feast of Christ the King and National Youth Sunday, a time when we celebrate the contribution of young people to the life and mission of the Catholic Church; it is also the day when we thank God for the many graces and blessings received during the Jubilee Year of Mercy which then draws to a close.

"I would like to invite all young adults to the Closing Mass of the Year of Mercy in St Barnabas Cathedral at 6pm that day, where the music will be provided by the musicians and choir from Nottingham University Catholic Chaplaincy. I hope that there will be students from all of the universities throughout the diocese, and young adults from as many parishes as possible. So I ask you to be particularly generous in inviting other young adults to travel with you.

"I invite you to gather first for tea and cake in the Cathedral Hall at 4pm. This will give me an opportunity to meet you and spend some time with you before Mass. Two young people will be making short presentations about their experience of being in Poland this summer for World Youth Day with Pope Francis; there will be some workshops on how we can build on the legacy of the Jubilee of Mercy and CAFOD's Step into the Gap in Zimbabwe. I would welcome the chance to listen to what you would like to see happen for young adults in our diocese and to share with you some forthcoming events.

"At 5.30pm we will move into the Cathedral to practise the music and prepare for Mass, and afterwards you are again invited to the Cathedral Hall for light refreshments.

"I look forward to meeting you, and I would like to thank you for being an active member of your parish or chaplaincy community." *Bishop Patrick*



YEAR OF MERCY

8th December 2015 - 20th November 2016 'God's Loving Mercy'



November is a traditional time of prayer in the Catholic Church for those who have died. Other Christian Churches seem puzzled by this prayer, seeing no need our loved ones are with God, awaiting the Resurrection.

How do Catholics explain their prayer?

"Purgatory" is the first answer - an understanding that few people die ready or worthy enough to immediately be with God. They need to be purified of their sinfulness. This purification was imagined as being in a place apart from God - we are not yet worthy to be in God's presence. We on earth pray for our departed loved ones, making up for their failures, forgiving them their sins and failings - in union with God's forgiving love. Do we need to think of Purgatory as a place? There is no such reference in the Scriptures - though there is mention of prayer for the dead. "Purification" might be a better word to use, and the image is of our coming before a loving God, longing to accept the fullness of God's love but aware of being unworthy. God's purifying love forgives and heals, and prayer (our human love) unites with God's love - telling the Holy Souls that we love them and long for them to receive and accept the fullness of God's love. Pope Benedict speaks like this of Purgatory in his beautiful book "Jesus Christ".
