BACKGROUND TO THE READINGS AT MASS TODAY

First Reading: Genesis 22:1-18

A wonderful story, telling of God's gentleness with Abraham, of Abraham's faith, of Isaac's peaceful acceptance of his near-death and a divine promise that passes from Abraham to his descendants. Human sacrifice was part of the ancient world. Abraham is simply asked if he will do for God what others did for their cruel false gods and idols. He accepts - having already sacrificed his past by leaving his homeland to come where God has led him, and now he is willing to sacrifice his future by offering the son given him in his old age. God's strange request is softened by the blessing that follows.

Today's reading teaches that every child belongs to God as well as to the parents. Human sacrifice is not acceptable and animal sacrifice is tolerated until the time of the perfect sacrifice offered by the Lamb of God.

Second Reading: Romans 8: 31-34

God did not offer or kill his own son - but gave him to us as a supreme gift. Paul has been speaking of the redemption of the universe, the whole of creation which has been soiled by sin.

Paul sees that the world is not as God intended it to be, but Christian hope in the divine plan inspires him in this part of the letter. Suddenly, he breaks into this passage of rejoicing: God is with us, gives us himself completely in his son, and will refuse us nothing.

Jesus is the Father's love incarnate; he died and rose for us and pleads for us with his Father.

The passage is almost a hymn - lyrical and full of joy.

Gospel Reading: Mark 9: 2-10

"Six days later" tells us that this is the seventh day, the Sabbath. Matthew puts it the same way, but Luke says "about eight days later" - making it the Lord's Day, the day after the Sabbath, the day of Resurrection. The symbolism of time is clearly intended by all three evangelists.

The mountain recalls the stories of Moses and Elijah on Mount Sinai - Moses receiving the Law and Elijah receiving reassurance from God. They make their appearance to talk with Jesus, representing the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). The cloud is the symbol of the presence of God throughout the Scriptures. In today's reading the Father speaks words in a way similar to the account of the Baptism of Jesus.

The whole story is beyond understanding - note Peter's confusion - because the apostles glimpse Jesus as he really is: something they could not understand until after the Resurrection.
