Jim and Liam had work in the Peak District. The first day they went looking for lodgings and asked at a local pub. The man said he didn't know of any but to come back later when his wife was at home. He asked Jim "Are you from Northern Ireland?" He was.


Outside Liam warned "He might call up some of the local boys to give you a hammering." "Local boys or not, I'm coming back," said Jim.

They returned and his wife was the there. There were no local digs but the two men were welcome to stay at the pub and free of charge.

"We couldn't do that," said Jim.

"Let me tell you a story," said the lady. "In World War II my brother was badly injured at Dunkirk. He was brought home to a hospital in Belfast to die. My parents asked me to go to be with my brother while he was dying. I travelled to Belfast. The hospital had no room for me and suggested I looked for local lodgings. It was a rough part of Belfast. I knocked on a door. The lady said there were no lodgings locally, why did I want to stay? I explained my brother, Dunkirk, dying at the hospital, my parents request. The lady said 'You're going to stay here as long as your brother is alive.' And I did. I've waited twenty years to say thank you to someone from Northern Ireland for that kindness - and you two men came looking for digs. You can stay here as long as you need."

Jim says he has always treasured that kindness.

#### Dear People,

The priests of our Leicester churches held our deanery meeting recently. One of the priests said "In five years time there will half the number of active priests in Leicester that there are now. It is the same around the diocese."

Bishop Patrick wants us to work together so that we can draw up a diocesan plan.

One obvious result of fewer priests is that many parishes will be looked after by the people (already happening elsewhere in the country) and we must start planning for this now.

After Easter we shall have an open parish meeting to look at the needs. Please suggest anything you would like discussed, but already the agenda is being set by the deanery:

(1) Holy Communion for the sick at home, in nursing and care homes, at the hospitals;

- (2) Celebration and times of mass;
- (3) Sacramental celebration, parishes sharing;
- (4) Children's Liturgy, music and singing,
  - serving, reading.
