Dear People,

Thank you for your comments about last week's homily on 'Humane Vitae' (Of Human Life) and the Church's teaching on birth control. You found your minds clearer about the issues - the teaching of the Church by the Pope in union with the bishops, the primacy of conscience, and the background to the Commission on birth control set up by Pope John XXIII and enlarged by Pope Paul VI.

You saw the human side of the Church, striving to understand God's loving will, reverence for life and sexual love, the wonder of life's being passed down the generations; and the sincerity of all those who want to teach the truth as they understand it and to live the truth as they experience it.

The Commission advised Pope Paul VI that a ban on artificial means of birth control could not be upheld by reason. That was key. Whatever the Pope and bishops finally gave to the Church would be based on faith, not reason. That was a tremendous lesson to learn. The minority report by the four priests (Ford, Visser, de Lestapis and Zalba) acknowledged that, but insisted that God would not have allowed the Church to be wrong for so long on so important an issue, and that the Church's traditional teaching - no artificial birth control, only natural methods - must be right, even though no reasons could be given.

I shared with you the dilemma for the loving spouses who could not understand or accept a teaching based on faith not reason, especially spouses who were not Catholic, who could say "This teaching is not based on reason and I cannot be bound by the faith of a Church to which I do not belong." You told me of the sadness of marriages where such tensions arose. That whole time was one of sadness and we saw a broken Pope Paul VI.

One lesson did become more clear, the supremacy of conscience. It is God we love and obey and serve. The Church guides us as far as possible in that loving relationship, then we freely decide to do what we truly believe to be right. No one takes away our freedom of conscience - not Church, not State, not Tribe. We are free as children of God to live for God. That teaching became clearer as the Church's debate raged, subsided, calmed.

The Church teaches every human being lives in God's love, is enlightened by that love even if seeming to know nothing about it! Human goodness we see all around us, it is God's gift. The Church guides its members in that goodness as far, as well, as it can.

God bless us to love and serve.
