Dear People,

In last week's Catholic press we read this:

"The sexual abuse scandal in the Catholic Church, which has wreaked such havoc on the lives of so many, has focused almost exclusively on cases involving children and young men. This might be about to change.

"The recent arrest of a bishop in India on charges of raping a nun raises questions about the abuse of women by priests and bishops . . . It is hard to imagine a more serious allegation than that of the rape of a religious sister by a bishop who is a patron of her Order. Yet it took many months of personal appeals, letter-writing and campaigning for the woman involved even to get an official acknowledgement of her allegations.

"When action was finally taken, it was by the police not by the Church. Even while senior members of the hierarchy were repeating the claim that 'zero tolerance' would be shown to any priests guilty of sexual abuse, they were ignoring this Indian nun's appeals for help.

"In the mid 90's, there was a brief flurry of publicity around well-founded reports of the wide-spread sexual abuse of women Religious by priests and bishops, particularly in Africa. More recently some nuns have been emboldened by the #MeTo movement to speak out about their experiences of harassment and abuse

"Is this a new crisis in the Church waiting to break, as women and girls who for too long have feared blame and shame if they speak out refuse to keep silent any longer? Yet this is not just about rape, abuse and harassment. In its continuing marginalisation of women, the Church risks becoming one of the last bastions of patriarchal privilege and male exclusivity. The are few signs of real willingness to change, even when opportunities to do so arise . . ."

I remember, when the stories of child abuse first began to break, children and families were criticised for daring to accuse priests - even, in some cases, being reprimanded for telling lies. The horror was beginning to become public. Now we know.

Dear People,

In St Peter's, Rome, today there will be seven new saints canonised: Pope Paul VI. Archibishop Oscar Romero, Nunzio Sulprizio, Francesco Spinelli, Vincenzo Romano, Maria Caterina Kasper, Nazaria Ignazia.

We rejoice at seven more examples of good lives and the work and faith they have inspired.

We hope that Oscar Romero's people will reioice more than they were allowed to when he was killed for speaking out for the poor against the cruelty of the right-wing regime that dominated his beloved El Salvador at a time when the Church was strangely silent about the oppression by right-wing regimes in the countries of Central and South America. You may remember the names of Pinochet in Chile, Videla and Galtieri in Argentina. The bishops of those two countries have apologised for their cowardice under the military regimes.

Such was the fear that only one bishop attended Archbishop Romero's Requiem mass. Shame on his cowardly fellow bishops
