Pope Francis on Friday last spoke his strongest condemnation of child sex abuse in the Church and ordered paedophiles to give themselves up to justice. He spoke particularly of priests and bishops (including those who hid the crimes) but also included members of families "where many wives, mothers and sisters were unable to detect those closest to them". The Pope is right to remind us that much abuse is carried out in families. The whole Church is wounded - but especially innocent helpless children.

Two Cardinals have been suspended from their duties in the Vatican as members of Pope Francis' inner group helping him in Church reform. No details given but we sadly know the reasons. An Australian bishop has spoken of the crisis in the Church in Australia and in the world. The Church is in dire need of reform.

The father was annoyed with his five-year-old daughter for wasting a roll of expensive gold wrapping paper. Money was tight, and he became even more upset when the child pasted the gold paper onto a box to put under the Christmas tree.

The little girl brought the gift box to her father the next morning and said, "This is for you, Daddy". The father was embarrassed, remembering his earlier overreactions, but his annoyance flared again when he found the box was empty.

He spoke to her harshly, "Don't you know, young lady, that when you give someone a present there's supposed to be something inside the package?"

The little girl looked up at him with tears in her eyes. "Oh, Daddy, it's not empty. I blew kisses into it until it was full."

The father was crushed. He fell on his knees and put his arms around his little girl and he begged her to forgive him for his anger.

An accident took the life of the child only a short time later and the father kept that gold box by his bed for the rest of his life. Whenever he was discouraged or faced a difficult problem he would open the box and take out an imaginary kiss, and remember the love of the child who had put it there.
