Dear People,

I admire patriotism, the love of one's country, of one's people but I dislike nationalism, the placing of one's own country as superior to others. Nationalism sees rivals, foreigners, immigrants, outsiders; patriotism shares love of country with all who share similar values.

"My country first" shouts Nationalism. "All peoples together" sings Patriotism, recognising others' love of their own countries. Patriotism unites in shared values, nationalism divides into "them" and "us". Both nationalism and patriotism are taught and learnt. Who are the teachers, students?

Nationalism play on the emotions, patriotism inspires love. Nationalism is easily expressed in the negatives of anger, suspicions, exclusions, but patriotism wants love of country to be shared and seeks mutual understanding.

Over these days of European Union elections we are going to see how far the nationalist politicians have succeeded in working on the peoples of their various countries. They have been working with each other, emphasizing what is wrong in the European Union, and appealing to the nationalist sentiment which puts one's country/people first.

In a "Union", as in a church, no one is first – we are together in common ideals. Patriotism seeks the common good, nationalism the national good.

All of us who are immigrants know the fear of rejection and exclusion. The Irish have certainly known it in parts of the United Kingdom, as have people of different races, colour, religion. To see it in our Church, as we do, even in our parish, is shameful. Sometimes I want to speak out in anger "There is racial and colour prejudice here, in our own church." What shame.

God bless us, brothers and sisters all.

The three forms of prayer that Fr John shared at our retreat on Wednesday last:



1 – <u>The Jesus Prayer</u>, so loved in the Eastern Orthodox Churches. "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

2 – <u>St Bernard's advice</u> to his monks: "Praise God. Thank God. Ask God for blessings."

3 – <u>The Prayer of Jabez</u>: "Bless me, guide me, be with me. Protect me from wrong-doing (two meanings, do you see them?) and from causing harm."

You will find Jabez in the First Book of Chronicles, chapter 4, verses 9-10. His name means "Pain" because his mother suffered in giving him birth (that would be all of us – everyone could be named "Jabez") but his prayer is a wonderful surprise in pages of names. Look for yourself, and see the courage and faith of his prayer.

Just near the blessed Sacrament Chapel, across the river from the Grotto, is a statue of Our Lady, holding Jesus just taken down from the cross. Prav. one of our pilgrims, writes

"I returned to look at the statue on Tuesday and an Irish lady, Angela, began to tell me about the statue. She said that the priest she had come with said that the hands were the hands of the Father, holding Jesus and Mary "into your hands I commend my spirit". We began to talk about this when 2 people walked into the garden, a man and woman. They listened to the conversation we were having and our mutual admiration and sorrow of the Passion of Christ. The man then asked where we were from. I replied Leicester and Angela began to talk about Ireland. The gentleman then introduced us to the lady who was with him - the actual sculptor !!! I was "star struck". Her name is de Faykod. He interpreted for us as she is French and doesn't speak any English.

"I managed to get just one photograph.. she was so humble..far from my vision of what the sculptor would look like. She also has sculptured the Stations of the Cross at Lourdes. She said that the statue outside the Adoration Chapel took a year and the Stations of the Cross took her 5 years to complete.
